#### **Permits**

- Call for Appointment
- Private Applicator Certificates R through Z expired 12/2008 - need two hours per year to renew or retake test

 Private Applicator certificate needed to use restricted material (CA, US, GW) and to train employees

## **Online Use Reports**

 Pesticide Use Reports and Notice of Intent (NOI's) can now be sent to Tehama County online



- Password protected access to your permit and use report history and pesticide info
- No cost
- Call Office for username, password
- Go online at: <a href="www.rmmsweb.com">www.rmmsweb.com</a> and click on Tehama

#### **Bee Protection**

- Applies to pesticides that are toxic to bees
- Label will have use restrictions
- May have to spray when bees not active or remove bloom
- If there is bloom in the area to be treated, you must contact Tri-County Bee Notification Service



#### **Bee Notification**

- Must call 48 hours prior to spray
- Glenn County Ag Dept 934-6666, 934-6501
- No Dormant Spray cutoff in Tehama County



## **Dormant Spray Regulation**

- Applies to sprays to dormant trees except oil, B.t. and spinosad
- Must hold runoff water for 72 hours or:
- Obtain a written rec from PCA
- 100 ft buffer to aquatic site
- Wind speed must be 3-10 MPH





## **Dormant Spray Regulation**

 Application by air is not allowed unless the orchard is not accessible by ground or bloom is approaching

 No Dormant sprays are allowed in soil if saturated and NOAA has predicted a storm within 48 hours.



- Adopted late 2007, enforcement began 2008
- Aligns pesticide respiratory protection regulations with other OSHA uses
- Applies only to employees using NIOSH/MSHA rated respirators
- Voluntary use of dust/mist respirators has minimal requirements (post info sheet)





- Employer must have written respiratory protection program
- Available online or from our office
- Program must have an administrator responsible for overseeing program
- Describes respirator use, maintenance and training

## **Respiratory Protection Program**

 Employee must complete a confidential medical evaluation and have it reviewed by a Physician or Licensed Health Care Professional (PLHCP)

 Employer will receive a medical recommendation from the PLHCP

- Fit Test must be done for each type of respirator that an employee uses
- Must be done prior to use, repeated annually, or if conditions change
- Commercial Fit Test kits available for purchase or service may be hired out
- Keep records for three years



## **Respiratory Regulation Protection**

- Enclosed cabs are NOT approved for respirator protection
- If a pesticide label requires the use of a respirator, one must be used even in an enclosed cab
- Label requirement stating 'avoid dust/mist', but no respirator may be met with an enclosed cab if properly operated



 Respirators or filters/cartridges must be discarded:

✓ at first indication of taste, odor, or irritation

✓ according to manufacturer's chemical specific instructions

✓ at the end of the work day

# **Proposed Notification Regulation**

 Public comment period closed in December

Probably will go into effect this spring

 Existing law requires Property Operator to notify employees who may enter or walk within ¼ mile of a treated field

## **Notification Regulation**

- Proposed Regulation will require notification to people <u>other</u> than employees that the property operator has reason to believe may enter treated fields during the REI
- If you know someone will be in a treated field during an REI
- If you <u>see</u> someone in a treated field during an REI



Utility, irrigation workers, etc.

# **Container Recycling**

 Proposed to begin January 1, 2010: person making first sale of pesticides into California must have a container recycling program

Plastic containers less than 55 gallons
