#### **Frequently Asked Questions:**

My tomatoes have lots of yellow like rings on them. What is wrong with them? (see picture)

You have tomato spot virus. Infected plants exhibit bronzing of the upper

sides of young leaves, which later develop distinct, necrotic spots. Leaves may be cupped downward. Some tip dieback may occur. On ripe fruit, chlorotic spots and blotches appear, often with concentric rings. Green fruit show slightly raised areas with faint, concentric zones.

**Solutions** The tomato spotted wilt virus is transmitted by thrips. Control thrips with applications of insecticidal soap. Removing and destroying infected plants can help control the spread of virus.

#### **Be A Water Saver**

Try these water saving tips:

- ◆Aerate lawns and ground around trees
- ◆Consider installing a drip system to flower beds
