4-H ONLINE DONATING NOW AVAILABLE

Online donations can now be designated to counties or programs and paid with a credit card. Please check out the new California 4-H website (www.ca4h.org). On every page you will notice a large blue "Donate Now" button which will direct donors to the Foundation donation web page. Online donations can be designated to go to specific counties or to specific programs and may be paid by credit card. 100% of the amount pledged goes directly to the program or county designated. Donors also have the option of making recurring pledges and unrestricted donations to be used where the need is greatest.

4-H/FFA/JUNIOR GRANGE MEMBERSHIP CLARIFIED

When a member maintains projects in 4-H, FFA and Junior Grange, the projects may not be in the same kind of livestock or crop. A member of an FFA chapter, Junior Grange or 4-H club may transfer projects from one organization to another only ONCE during a calendar year. To be able to show a project at a fair or show, it must be under the supervision of the organization under which it will be shown for at least 60 days prior to the fair or show (120 days for a market beef.) The complete agreement is available at the 4-H Office.

COLUSA COUNTY 4-H LIVESTOCK NEWS

At the October 21, 2010 meeting the Livestock Committee heard from Fair Board Director Bob Vierra concerns that market animal weights were climbing too



high in recent years. He asked leaders and members to self police this matter this year and use good weight management and animal husbandry. If the trend continues the Fair will take measures to assure animals weigh under desired limits. Additional news from the board was that the Sale of Champions will begin at 2:00 p.m. this year and he advised everyone to read the premium book carefully, especially regarding the rules for fitting of animals. Preliminary weigh in for all market animals is optional unless required by club/chapter or project rules. To compete in Rate of Gain contests animals must be weighed at the preliminary weigh ins. All entry forms and fees must be turned in by the weigh in date for that specie. If animals are not weighed at preliminary they will be tagged and weighed upon arrival at the Fair.

Last year's beef judging day included classes of steers, heifers, and bulls with a lesson on feeding from Joe Lemenager. Making the best better, Chair Stephanie Meyers will coordinate with the other beef leaders to improving the Beef Field Day this year. Date and place TBA. The swine field day was well attended for the judging portion and for the educational portion not as many participated. Those that stayed gained worthwhile knowledge on raising and showing pigs. It was recommended if held again, the educational portion be held first, followed by judging to encourage better participation. Swine members this year may receive their training at the CSUChico, Shasta College and UC Davis swine and/or livestock educational days.

FACILITY USE PERMITS

Simply bring them to the 4-H Office and we will complete the necessary paperwork to insure that your members are insured. Allow at least 4 weeks.

TechXcite is an engineering curriculum, developed by Duke University and sponsored by the National Science Foundation (NSF), to engage youth in after school, camp and club settings in rich and vibrant exploration of engineering, mathematics, science and technology. 4-H staff, volunteers, and afterschool partners in Butte, Merced, Santa Cruz, Monterey, and Los Angeles Counties participate in this project.
