Frequently Asked Questions:

Now that the weather has cooled off, can I stop watering the lawn and flower beds?

Your watering needs are reduced, but no you should not stop watering until we get regular winter rains. If we have a drought year you may need to water thru the winter. In the Fall, our evenings are much cooler but the days are still warm and we usually get strong hot north winds.

Solution: For lawn watering read <u>"Lawn Watering Guide"</u> and use the chart on the back for reference. You may need to adjust the times for your soil type and sun exposure.

Flower beds and shrubs are a little trickier. You need to be more observant. Dig down a few inches and if the soil is moist that's good, if not apply water. Applying mulch will help keep the soil moist.

Be A Water Saver

Try these water saving tips:

◆Remove the accumulation of old grass, roots, stem and leaves, called thatch on your lawn.

Save Our Water
