Frequently Asked Questions:

How do I keep my Poinsettias alive through the season?

Poinsettias are tropical plants.

- Do not buy plants that are outside.
- Do not leave the plants in the car over night.
- Do not put your plants outside.
- Keep plants above 60 degrees in your house.
- Do not overwater!
- Water a little bit when the soil gets dry. If you overwater let the container drain in your sink.

Fun Facts

- California is the top poinsettia producing state.
- December 12 is National Poinsettia Day.
- 80% of poinsettias are purchased by women.
- 61 million plants were sold in 6 weeks in 2004.
- 74% of Americans still prefer red poinsettias.

Be A Water Saver

Try these water saving tips:

- ◆Prune trees and other woody plants only when necessary. Pruning stimulates shoot growth, which increases water needs.
- ◆In winter, water only when soil becomes dry.

Save Our Water
