Home Economics Review Colusa County 4-H

Colusa County 4-H has held a Home Economics and Arts judging event for at least 20 years. Over the years it has evolved into an event that combines judging activities and project exhibition for 4-H members interested in home economics and consumer science topics such as foods and nutrition, home furnishings, arts and crafts, mini gardens, and cake decorating. Now called the "Colusa County Home Ec Review," this event provides a platform for 4-H members to showcase their projects and skill development at a countywide event. The event encourages the advancement of life skills including decision making, public speaking and relationship building, all while promoting creativity.

The Home Ec Review gives 4-H members the opportunity to participate as much as they would like, whether they decide to just test the water or dive in head first. Members who participate in the judging classes may leave after an hour, and still fulfill a requirement for their project. Often, members will have limited participation the first year, but after watching their peer's exhibit they are inspired to exhibit the following year. In this way, new members are slowly introduced to 4-H project components, while also getting invaluable learning experiences and receiving feedback from caring adults.

The Home Ec Review is a combination of three traditional 4-H events—it serves as the Home Economics Field Day, Project Exhibit Day, and offers the opportunity to introduce 4-H initiatives such as S.E.T. and Healthy Living. In a rural county it is increasingly important to efficiently use 4-H families' time and energy.

OVER 80 4-H YOUTH ATTEND FIELD DAY

Over 80 Colusa County 4-H youth attended the annual Lamb and Goat Field Day held earlier in January at the Bob and Cindy Freed residence in Williams.

Participants, sponsors and volunteers at the field day agreed that it was yet another successful event, and there was a lot of enthusiasm for the programs and workshops provided throughout the day.

A number of workshops were presented including topics such as parts

and cuts of a goat by Drex Minto of Stonyford. Ralph Minto, also of Stonyford presented a workshop on choosing a market goat. Kelsey McKinley of Maxwell 4-H & Kristine Martin, formerly of Colusa 4-H brought a workshop on choosing market lambs & also provided hands on instruction on how to set up lambs in the show ring.



A gestation, lambing, tail docking, castrating and vaccination clinic was presented by Cindy Freed. This workshop provided the participants with hands on experience with vaccines by giving an IM (intramuscular) injection into an orange.

Dr. Celina Johnson from California State University Chico attended the field day to present carcass evaluation and stomach analysis seminars. Dr. Matthew Portillo, Butte County 4-H advisor & Mike Cook, Butte County 4-H Livestock Committee Chair gave every member experience in ultra sound readings & calculating back fat.

Louis Cairo's donated beverages and lunches, consisting of lamb, including shepherd's pie & lamb gyros. Cindy Freed provided barbecued goat meat, salad & dessert. Cristy Edwards, co-owner of Louis Cairo's was assisted by Hi 4-H members Kaily McKinley and Searah Robertson.

As an observer of the program, Edwards said she was very impressed with the presentations and the enthusiasm of the participants the day of the Field Day, and that she is happy Louis Cairo's could help a little. Exploring Trees and Ponds

Informal Life Science Activities for Youth

A little background, first...

In recent years, there has been a growing movement to get youth outdoors to explore the natural world. Youth have an inherent curiosity about natural objects such as trees and pond organisms. This interest can be the focus for an extended exploration of natural phenomena and act as an experiential foundation for developing life science concepts as well as a life-long appreciation of the outdoor environment.

As part of the *Exploring Trees and Ponds* project, funded by the National Science Foundation, EDC has recently launched a website that provides a program of activities for exploring these two phenomena. This site outlines an extended, structured exploration of trees and pond and provides detailed directions for carrying out the activities. A special feature of this project is the use of digital cameras; youth use this technology to both capture artistic moments and carry out scientific inquiry.
