#### **MERIT AWARD, ALL STAR & SCHOLARSHIP APPLICATIONS**

DUE: APRIL 15, 2011

<u>Merit Award</u> – applicants must be 8<sup>th</sup> grade graduates by June 2011 or 14 years of age or older. A prime consideration in the selection will be how much work, assistance and cooperation the member has given to younger members, leaders, and the club program. The award is a full scholarship to the State 4-H Leadership Conference at UC Davis, July 28 - July 31, 2011.

<u>All Star</u> – applicants must be 15 years of age as of January 2011, have a Gold Star or are eligible to attain a Gold Star this year. Up to 4 members may be chosen to serve as All Stars. Duties include attending State 4-H Leadership Conference, present at Achievement Night, other countywide events, represent 4-H at public events and be a counselor at 4-H summer camp.

**<u>College Scholarship</u>** – Any graduating senior that is a 4-H member should call the 4-H office and request an application to be sent to them.

There are 3 components to scholarship;

- 1) Enrollment award based on your years enrolled in 4-H
- 2) Merit award is based on your interview and record book
- 3) Renewable scholarship for each scholarship awarded, Council will set aside \$1500. You can reapply for three additional years, and be awarded \$500 per year if you meet the requirements: Completion of application, full time student with passing grades, and your transcript from the previous year.

## **COLUSA 4-H SWINE PROJECT**

The Colusa 4-H Swine Project Group had a meeting on January 24, 2011 at 5:30 pm in the CIP Room. We went over fair ear notch cards, the CSUC Swine Day and had some kids do their swine presentations. The presentations that were done were the breeds of pigs by Kate Mobley and Brandon Vaca. Then we had another presentation on how to wash your hog by Michelle Ahola and Ciera Green. The last presentation was on housing of pigs by Chelsie and Jordon Savage.

## CROSS YOUR NIAGARA FALLS

When engineers were contemplating building a bridge over the gorge below Niagara Falls, the first problem was to get a line across the chasm. It was impossible to do by boat and the airplane had not yet been invented. Also, the distance was beyond bow and arrow range. As a creative solution, designing engineer Charles Ellet held a kite-flying contest, offering a cash prize to the first person to fly a kite across the gorge and allow it to go low enough for someone on the ground to grab the kite string.

The string led to a cord, then a line, and next a rope. The came cables until there was support sturdy enough for a suspension bridge to be built.

"Think of that kite string as a single thought in your mind," suggests Denis Waitley, a psychologist and internationally known speaker. "The more vivid and clear the thought, and the more you come back to it, the stronger it becomes--like a string to a rope to a cable.

"Each time you rethink it or dwell on it or layer it with other thoughts, you are creating a cognitive map, like building a bridge over Niagara Falls," Says Waitley. "That map will become so strong and real that your mind and body will automatically respond to it and improvise when the ravine widens suddenly or the environment changes."

The 2011 National 4-H Shooting Sports Instructor Training Workshop is scheduled for May 15 – 20 at the Iowa 4-H Center in Madrid, Iowa. The co-host states of this event are Iowa and Minnesota.
