Frequently Asked Questions:

My tomatoes are dying and it doesn't seem to matter what I do. What is wrong?

There is a good chance that it is Tomato Spotted Wilt Virus. We had a terrible time with it last year.

Infected plants exhibit bronzing of the upper sides of young leaves, which later develop distinct, necrotic spots. Leaves may be cupped downward. Some tip dieback may occur. On rip fruit, chlorotic spots and blotches appear, often with concentric rings. Green fruit show slightly raised areas with faint, concentric zones.

The virus is carried by an insect, Thrips. Thrips are very difficult to control. Remove and destroy infected plants to help control the spread of the virus. See <u>www.ipm.ucdavis.edu</u>
