Components of a Successful Urban Tree Program

- Citizen desired
- Laws Tree Preservation Code, Standards, Specs, General Plan
- **Enforcement** Municipal Arborist, Code Enforcement, police
- Judges A fair & balanced appeal system
- Penalty/Rewards Providing a "carrot & stick"
- **Enforcement of Penalty/Rewards Actions & Liens**
- A procedure to mitigate for removal Plant or pay
- Citizen + hired/elected personnel support All of this must be reasonable to continue receiving required support ³

- Out dated code
- **Old specifications**
- Failing trees needing care...now!
- Conflicts between infrastructure & trees
- **Expensive irrigation** operational practices
- Poorly designed & outdated parks
- Overly used and now run down facilities
- Low budget that is now receiving less funding
- A mandate to do more with less

- Who is responsibilities for: trees, landscaping, & irrigation in: parks, open space, "street trees", Lighting & Landscape areas?
- Are Public Works or Code Enforcement responsible for tree clearance issues?

Do You Reviews Landscape & Irrigations Plans – Specifications?

- Is there a check list for the owner, surveyor, architect, engineer, developer, & landscape architect to follow?
- Does the community have a recommended/approved list of trees to be used?
- Is there a minimum size tree to be utilized?
- What is the diversity requirement? 30-20-10 or 15-15-5?
- Percent "parking lot shade" calculation & how?
- Required "street tree(s)" and their specifications?
- Requirements for emergency access, trash, parking, ADA, deliveries, and signage
- Can lighting & photometric requirements be met?

Issuance of Permits:

Building, Excavation/Demo, Tree, & Encroachment

- Issue these all at the same time
- If issued separately, you may have protected trees destroyed or compromised
- If issued separately, you may end up with a bare lot that is not built upon for years or decades



New systems, devices, and planning:

- Photometrics (lumens per sq meter)
- Solar panels (blockage &/or parking lot shade)
- Low Impact Development (LID)
- Porous surfaces for streets, parking lots, walks, & patios
- Tree growth regulators (good &/or problematic)
- Root barriers (pros & cons)
- New irrigation controller features:
 - Zip Code controlled time clocks
 - Soil based moisture sensors
 - Rain event shut-off controls
 - High usage (line break) shut off sensors
 - Satellite controlled time clocks





Population (explosion)?






- Which trees will prefer warmer temperatures?
- Which pests & diseases will move into your zone if the temperatures keep rising?




USA Temperature changes 1990 -2006

Assume Warmer & Drier...

- Trees that can be weaned from irrigation
- An expanded and more diverse tree pallet
- Use 30-20-10 for smaller projects
 - 30% max Genus
 - 20% max Species
 - 10% max Cultivar
- Larger projects (60 trees +) 15-10-5

DO NOT DISTURB THIS AREA WITHOUT SPECIFIC AUTHORIZATION FROM THE CITY OF FOLSOM CITY ARBORIST.

Within this TPZ fenced area there shall be NO: storage of material, grubbing, excavation, dumping of chemicals, attaching anything to trees, boring, trenching, animals, people, grade changes, pruning, or any activities that may damage these protected trees.

This fence shall <u>not</u> be moved throughout the entire construction process, unless written consent is given from the City Arborist or Community Development Department. This TPZ fence with signs shall be maintained in proper upright condition at all times.

Fines will be levied if this TPZ tence and signs are not properly maintained or moved without written permission

FAILURE TO PROTECT TREES WILL RESULT IN AN IMMEDIATE 'STOP WORK NOTICE' AND MAY RESULT IN MISDEMEANOR CHARGES AND FINES OF UP TO \$10,000.00 PER VIOLATION PER THE FOLSOM MUNICIPAL CODE.


