SPARKS SCORE

4-H Thrive is awarding \$20 gift cards to every 4-H Volunteer and Member that completes all SPARKS Score Questions (including the "Bonus" ones) and adult observation tools in the 4-H Online Record Book (ORB). Sparks Score Questions appear twice a year; you must complete both time points to be eligible for these gifts. In addition, these same individuals will automatically be entered into a drawing to win a new iPad Mini. The current SPARKS Score Questions and adult observation tools must be completed in ORB no later than February 15, 2013 to be considered. The second set will appear in ORB beginning May 1st, these must be completed by August 31, 2013.

In addition, counties that have at least 30 youth who complete all of their Sparks Score Questions will receive a specialized countywide Data Sheet which the state office will develop specifically for your county.

APPLICATIONS OPEN FOR CALIFORNIA FARM BUREAU SCHOLARSHIPS



Students planning to pursue careers as farmers, ranchers or in other agricultural occupations may now apply for 2013 California Farm Bureau Scholarship Foundation scholarships. Applications are available online at www.cfbf.com/programs/scholar. The deadline for submissions is **March 1**.

Applications are open to students who are Farm Bureau collegiate members in California. The scholarships are given based on students' academic achievements, leadership skills, career goals, extracurricular activities and other factors.

Last year marked a milestone year for the foundation, which awarded \$202,250 in scholarships and surpassed \$2 million in scholarships distributed since the foundation's inception in 1955. More than 70 students benefited from foundation scholarships in 2012.

In addition to general scholarships, the foundation grants six special scholarships following interviews with applicants. Four of the special scholarships are given in memory of former California Farm Bureau leaders and staff members; two scholarships are donated by the Ag Lenders Society of California.

The California Farm Bureau Scholarship Foundation also helps oversee distribution of the Rustici Livestock and Rangeland Scholarship Awards, which benefit rangeland-management students who plan careers in beef or sheep ranching or in range management.

Colusa County 4-H has held a Home Economics and Arts judging event for at over 20 years. Over the years it has evolved into an event that combines judging activities and project exhibition for 4-H members interested in home economics and consumer science topics such as foods and nutrition, home furnishings, arts and crafts, mini gardens, and cake decorating. Now called the "Colusa County Home Ec Review," this event provides a platform for 4-H members to showcase their projects and skill development at a countywide event. The event encourages the advancement of life skills including decision making, public speaking and relationship building, all while promoting creativity.

The Home Ec Review gives 4-H members the opportunity to participate as much as they would like, whether they decide to just test the water or dive in head first. Members who participate in the judging classes may leave after an hour, and still fulfill a requirement for their project. Often, members will have limited participation the first year, but after watching their peer's exhibit they are inspired to exhibit the following year. In this way, new members are slowly introduced to 4-H project components, while also getting invaluable learning experiences and receiving feedback from caring adults.

The Home Ec Review is a combination of three traditional 4-H events—it serves as the Home Economics Field Day, Project Exhibit Day, and offers the opportunity to introduce 4-H initiatives such as S.E.T. and Healthy Living. In a rural co unty it is increasingly important to efficiently use 4-H families' time and energy.

Members may enter a table setting and a stand-alone entry in the same project. Remember members must be enrolled in the project to exhibit in the category. Information and registration packets are online at <u>http://cecolusa.ucanr.edu/4-H_Program/Forms/</u>.

MERIT AWARD, ALL STAR & SCHOLARSHIP APPLICATIONS

DUE: APRIL 15, 2013

<u>Merit Award</u> – applicants must be 8th grade graduates by June 2013 or 14 years of age or older. A prime consideration in the selection will be how much work, assistance and cooperation the member has given to younger members, leaders, and the club program. The award is a full scholarship to the State 4-H Leadership Conference at UC Davis, July 25 - July 28, 2013.

<u>All Star</u> – applicants must be 15 years of age as of January 2013, have a Gold Star or are eligible to attain a Gold Star this year. Up to 4 members may be chosen to serve as All Stars. Duties include attending State 4-H Leadership Conference, present at Achievement Night, other countywide events, represent 4-H at public events and be a counselor at 4-H summer camp.

<u>College Scholarship</u> – Any graduating senior that is a 4-H member should call the 4-H office and request an application to be sent to them.

There are 3 components to scholarship;

- 1) Enrollment award based on your years enrolled in 4-H
- 2) Merit award is based on your interview and record book
- 3) Renewable scholarship for each scholarship awarded, Council will set aside \$1500. You can reapply for three additional years, and be awarded \$500 per year if you meet the requirements: Completion of application, full time student with passing grades, and your transcript from the previous year.

POLICY UPDATES

4-H Policy Handbook (Chapter 9 VII)

This time of year many of you have questions about gift and fundraising for groups and individuals. The University has recently revised Chapter 9, Section VII "Financial Management in the 4-H Youth Development Program" of the 4-H Policy Handbook.

Following is a brief summary of FAQ:

- Fundraising to Benefit Groups or Organization by 4-H Units and VMO's FAQ
- Funds should not be raised for a particular 4-H individual. When money is raised for 4-H it is for the group or team and not for individual members.
- 4-H groups may collect non-cash items (e.g. jackets, toys, food) or cash contributions (cash or checks) that are then used to buy supplies and materials to carry out their service learning activities.
- 4-H members may not fundraise for a specific individual or family. For example, it would be inappropriate to fund-raise to help the "Smith Family" who were victims of a wildfire. It would, however, be appropriate to fundraise for "fire victims" or for an organization this is assisting fire victims.
- Gifts to Individuals Businesses or Organizations by 4-H Units and VMOs FAQ
- Fundraising for other groups or organizations and the giving of gifts to individuals, businesses or organizations are two different things.
- The giving of cash gifts (cash or checks) to individuals is not allowed. However, honoraria payments are permissible. Scholarship or awards for which criteria and a selection process have been clearly outlined are allowed, as they are not considered gifts.
- The giving of cash gifts (cash or checks) to businesses or organizations is not allowable. Gifts may, however, be given to the California 4-H Foundation whose charitable mission is to raise finical resources for the benefit of the California 4-H YDP.
- Guidelines for Fundraising to Benefit Groups or Organizations by 4-H Units and VMOs
- All fundraising activities by charted 4-H units and VMOs must be approved by the membership either through an adopted budget or action (i.e., vote) by the unit or VMO. The annual budget must be sub-mitted to the UCCE office for review by the county director.
- All proposed fundraising activities must be submit-ted to the UCCE office for approval by the country director.
- If the proposed fundraising activities involve the collection of cash contributions (cash or checks) the charted 4-H units and VMOs should include the in-come and expense in their annual budget.
- 4-H groups may collect non-cash items or cash contributions that are then used to buy supplies and materials to carry out their service learning activity. They may not donate cash to any group or organization outside of 4-H.
- When a 4-H group engages in a fundraising activity to benefit another group (e.g., fire victims) or organization (e.g., Red Cross) a sign must be posted to make clear to potential donors that the funds will be used to benefit the other group or organization.
- If a 4-H group is fundraising to benefit a nonprofit or tax-exempt organization they should work with the charitable organization ahead of time to obtain tax receipts that can be given to donors upon collection of the contribution.
- It would be appropriate for the 4-H group to give the individual(s) who made a contribution to benefit the outside group or organization a thank you letter to let them know that this was a service learning activity of the California 4-H Youth Development Pro-gram and tell them about our program.
