4-H Scrapbooking Proficiency

OVERVIEW

The 4-H Scrapbooking Proficiency program helps you learn what you need to know about your 4-H project. Your project leader will assist you in setting and achieving your goals. Through your project, you will acquire an understanding of the principles of artistic design: color, spacing, formatting, and creative use of texture. You will also learn how to make good use of your leisure time in constructive activities as well as learning to make useful, artistic pages.

There are many resources to help you learn more about your project:

- Check to see if there are organizations in your community that conduct educational activities and shows. Local artists can be an excellent source of help and information.

There are two levels in the Project Proficiency Program. You may choose how many levels you wish to complete:

- Level I "Explorer", you begin to learn about many different aspects of scrapbooking.
- Level II "Producer", you practice and refine the many skills involved in scrapbooking.

As you work through the proficiency program, your leader will date each skill item as you complete it.

10.	Explain ten new terms that you have learned for this project.
11.	Complete three items in this project.
12.	Identify four different projects that you would like to make. Explore the cost, techniques and materials for each project. Make the projects you feel you complete.
13.	Write down a list of the items needed and figure out how much it will cost to make one scrapbooking page.
14.	Demonstrate how "layout" is used in your scrapbooking.
15.	Explain how the skills or knowledge you have learned in this project can help you in the future.
