ACHIEVEMENT AWARDS

Each year, usually during National 4-H Week, members and leaders receive incentives and recognition for the previous year's work. EMERALD STAR

It's time to start planning Emerald Star projects. The Emerald Star is an optional award between Gold and All Stars. The member obtains a Personal Development Report (PDR) form from the 4-H Office. In order to achieve the Emerald Star the member does a community service project in addition to performing PDR requirements from the Emerald Star column. Note: the PDR form from the state 4-H site does not work for this star award. Emerald Star Project Plans are due in the 4-H Office on November 1st.

BEGINNING A NEW YEAR

The 4-H Youth Development Program of the University of California is committed to providing a safe environment for young people involved in Cooperative Extension activities. All volunteer leaders are required to enroll online (each year), be fingerprinted for a background check and attend an orientation meeting one time only, (unless there is a break in service.) If a volunteer plans to take a year off they are encouraged to enroll and pay the \$12.00 fee so they do not need to re-do orientation and fingerprinting the following year. Any adult chaperoning an event (camp, SLC, etc.) must sign up as a 4-H leader and go through the process prior to the event.

We are asking each of you to recruit one new leader. We know everyone is busy so encourage them to take the team approach. Two or three leaders can share the six hour minimum project requirement, making their time commitment for a project not as demanding. Without our volunteer leaders, the projects available will decrease and so will our enrollment. Let's all help to keep our youth in Colusa County involved in this worthwhile program.

Activities will turn young people into geospatial thinkers as they design and map their ideal park, use GIS mapping to solve community problems and contribute data about their community to the United States Geological Survey. California 4-H to Host NYSD Events

The 4-H National Youth Science Experiment is the perfect opportunity to promote 4-H to the community while sparking the interest of youth in learning more about 4-H science, engineering, and technology activities. 4-H Clubs and countywide 4-H projects/groups are encouraged to host a 4-H NYSD event. This could be at an existing community festival or a 4-H meeting. The event may be planned by the County 4-H Office, a 4-H Club, group of 4-H volunteers and members, an All Star team, or as an Emerald Star project.

To request these resources, 4-H staff, volunteers, or youth must complete the online form by September 10, 2013. An order will be placed for kits on September 11 and shipped directly to the County 4-H Office of each group.

Limits: Available resources include 125 experiment kits total (each kit serves 10 youth and retails for \$24.95/each). A maximum of 3 kits may be requested for any one group (4-H Club/project). Kits will be provided on a first-come, firstserved basis.
