Members may enter a table setting and a stand-alone entry in the same project. Remember members must be enrolled in the project to exhibit in the category. Information and registration packets will be available at the January Council meeting for all non-livestock project leaders.

ONLINE RECORD BOOK

The 4-H program has a long history of record keeping. The focus reflects the importance of this lifeskill in our daily lives. In 4-H, young people have tracked their activities, events, profits and losses, skill development and learning experiences, and much more using the iconic 4-H Record Book. In addition to record keeping, the 4-H Record Book gives members an opportunity to reflect on their year, measure their achievements and growth, and set goals, and develop plans to meet those goals.

Why have 4-H record books?

4-H Record Books serve a variety of purposes in the California 4-H Youth Development Program. 4-H Record Books give members an opportunity to reflect on their yearly work. They document their skill



development and their learning experiences in a written report. 4-H members measure their achievements and growth in their total years in 4-H.

4-H Record Books encourage members to set goals, pursue strategies to meet those goals, and to shift gears in the face of challenges and obstacles. Completion of the Personal Development Report awards 4-H members for participation in 4-H activities, which provides an incentive for participation, learning, and achievement.

Completing a 4-H Record Book is a process where 4-H members record project and club work. Records management (RM) is a competency skill to identify, create, classify, archive, and preserve records. The 4-H Record Book teaches 4-H members these skills through a standard format.

Not Required for 4-H Membership

4-H Record Books are not required for membership or for participation in 4-H activities such as club events and activities, or for attending 4-H camps or conferences. 4-H Record Books may be required by project leaders or clubs or to receive participation awards (such as star ranking, medals or pins based on 4-H Record Book achievements).

Enrolled 4-H members and adult volunteer leaders may access the Online Record Book. The system uses 4hOnline enrollment data to pre-fill in club and project information.

The system will export the forms needed for submitting a hardcopy Record Book at the end of the year. So use the 4-H Online Record Book!

The 4-H Online Record Book: Has a social connection! It extends opportunities to stay connected to other club members and leaders online. Is a fun and interactive way to log 4-H activities and events. Is a more efficient way to keep Record Book information. No more worries about lost pages or misplaced work.

4-H/FFA/JUNIOR GRANGE MEMBERSHIP CLARIFIED

When a member maintains projects in 4-H, FFA and Junior Grange, the projects may not be in the same kind of livestock or crop. A member of an FFA chapter, Junior Grange or 4-H club may transfer projects from one organization to another only ONCE during a calendar year. To be able to show a project at a fair or show, it must be under the supervision of the organization under which it will be shown for at least 60 days prior to the fair or show (120 days for a market beef.) The complete agreement is available at the 4-H Office.

CANNED FOOD DRIVE & VOLUNTEERS NEEDED

The Colusa County Food Basket Association is once again asking community groups to conduct a canned food drive to assist with the holiday food basket giveaway.

Each year approximately 450 Colusa County families receive a food basket in December for the holiday season. County schools, churches and community organizations collect canned goods and donate them to be placed in the food baskets. Along with the canned goods, monetary donations are given and with these funds milk, eggs, bread, ham, potatoes, oatmeal, sugar, flour and butter are purchased and placed in the basket as well.



We are asking each community 4-H club to collect a couple of canned goods from each of their members during the month of November and bring them to the Main Exhibit Hall on Sunday, Dec 8th at 2:00 p.m. or Monday, December 9th between 8-10am. Last year many of the clubs did a canned food structure and donated those canned goods to the food basket program, which helped tremendously. So once again we are reaching out to the clubs and ask that if at all possible they have this community service activity and help us out.

Help setting up for the Food Basket will take place on Sunday, December 8th at 2:00pm in the Main Exhibit Building at the fairgrounds. Clubs may bring their dry goods collections that day and help set up the building. This counts as a community service credit.
