BEGINNING A NEW YEAR

The 4-H Youth Development Program of the University of California is committed to providing a safe environment for young people involved in Cooperative Extension activities. All volunteer leaders are required to enroll online (each year), be fingerprinted for a background check and attend an orientation meeting one time only, (unless there is a break in service.) If a volunteer plans to take a year off they are encouraged to enroll and pay the \$12.00 fee so they do not need to re-do orientation and fingerprinting the following year. Any adult chaperoning an event (camp, SLC, etc.) must sign up as a 4-H leader and go through the process prior to the event.

We are asking each of you to recruit one new leader. We know everyone is busy so encourage them to take the team approach. Two or three leaders can share the six hour minimum project requirement, making their time commitment for a project not as demanding. Without our volunteer leaders, the projects available will decrease and so will our enrollment. Let's all help to keep our youth in Colusa County involved in this worthwhile program.

<u>All families need to enroll in 4-H without delay. Meetings/events begin in September.</u> On November 1st access to online enrollment is blocked. Those enrolling after this deadline must do so at the 4-H Office.

MEMBERSHIP POLICY

As of July 1, 2014 grade in school is no longer part of the policy. The policy is by age of **member.** There are different age levels of 4-H YDP participation and involvement. Youth are eligible to participate in 4-H if they meet the following criteria:

Primary 4-H Members: Primary members must be 5 years old by December 31st of the program year. Youth enrolling who turn nine on or after January 1, must participate as a primary member until June 30th. Primary members cannot enroll in large animal projects. Approved primary member animal projects are dogs, rabbits, rats, cats, poultry, cavies, mice, embryology, bees, entomology, marine science, pygmy, Nigerian dwarf goats and therapeutic animal projects. For a complete list of approved primary member projects, see the <u>California 4-H Project List</u>. Primary members who exhibit in shows and fairs, do so based on their age as of December 31st of the program year regardless of when the fair or show is conducted during the calendar year.

Junior, Intermediate and Senior 4-H Members: Must be 9 years old by December 31st of the program year and may continue in the program until December 31st of the calendar year in which they become 19 years of age.

Home Schooled Members: Youth enroll based on their chronological age as of December 31st.

Special Needs Members: Special needs youth enroll in the program based on their chronological age and follow the 4-H YDP age requirements of 5 - 19 years of age. Any extensions beyond the age of 19 of special needs youth must be approved annually by the county director.

Members as Adult Volunteers: An individual must be 18 years or older to become an adult volunteer. A 4-H member cannot simultaneously be an adult volunteer.

New leaders need attend only one of these orientations, have fingerprint clearance, complete enrollment and pay \$12.00 in order to be a 4-H volunteer.
