#### • Beverly Hills Heart Helpers

This past month the Beverly Hills Heart Helpers started on their quilts for the Painted Turtle, a camp in Lake Hughes, CA for kids and teens with serious illnesses. The Club also partnered with the City of Beverly Hills to conduct an El Nino Preparation Day where the club members helped to pick up trash from the street and storm drain inlets that would otherwise run out to the ocean when the big rains come. Two 4Hers presented at the Beverly Hills City Council about their research on swales and asked the City Council to allow the Heart Helpers to adopt one of the swales that will be created along Santa Monica Boulevard. Heart Helper Sean Coffey received a \$100 grant from the Start a Snowball Foundation to purchase more recycle bins for his Cans for a Cause project which has raised over \$300 to support the LGBT Center on Highland in Hollywood. They also visited the Gentle Barn in Santa Clarita where they brushed cows, fed the horses and learned about the different rescue animals that live there. The Club's visit was funded through a generous donation of Heart Helper friend Skip Zelenka.

#### • IMPORTANT - Record Book Manual 2015-2016 And Forms

Record Book Manual 2015-2016 is the only record manual and forms that should be used this year. Please discard all previous record book manuals and forms. The Manual is available on the state 4-H website and on our county website. The online record book system uses the forms from this 2015-2016 manual. If you have questions contact a member of the county I&R Committee or Noel Keller (nkeller91711@gmail.com).

The record book information actually exists as three separate manuals: guidelines, forms and adult partner's guide. The California 4-H Record Book Manual: For Junior, Intermediate and Senior4-H Members gives details on how to complete your records. The California 4-H Record Book Forms: For Junior, Intermediate and Senior4-H Members includes all the record book forms. The California 4-H Record Book Manual: Adult Partner's Guide gives further information and guidelines on the changes in the new manual.

Leadership Development Report (LDR) Replaces Junior and Teen Leadership Development Report (JTLDR)

The Junior and Teen Leadership Development Report of past years has been replaced with the Leadership Development Report. There are four parts to the form: Part 1 (Pre), Part 1 (Post), Part 2 (Pre) and Part 2 (Post). Part 1 asks for your general leadership roles and goals at the start of the 4-H program year and then what you learned by the end of the year. Part 2 is used for specific project or activity goals and results. Complete a Part 2 (Pre) and (Post) for each project or activity where you fill a significant leadership role. You must complete this form for each significant leadership credit on your Personal Development Report (PDR). A member may be completing several Part 2 forms for their records.

#### • Iunior/Teen Leader Merit Awards

As part of the county annual record judging, 4-H junior and teen members are invited to have their records evaluated for a Leader Merit Award. This award is to recognize outstanding leadership by Junior and Teen Leaders. A member may request on their ID form for the county record book judging form that their records be evaluated for a merit award. A member may only earn a Junior Leader Merit Award once and a Teen Merit Award once.

To be considered for a leader merit award, the 4-H member must be enrolled in a Leadership project and complete the Annual Project Report form for the Leadership project. If your club does not have a Leadership Project, request that one be set up in your club. The member must also complete the new Leadership Development Report (LDR) for 2015-2016 to be considered for the award. Both forms are available on the County website under Record Book forms. Remember to complete both of these forms if you request to be considered for the award. Each year almost half of those who request to be considered for the award do not complete both of these forms. If you have any questions about this, please contact a member of the county I&R Committee.

#### • State Records Competition

Senior 4-H members are eligible to enter the state record book competition. State competition is focused on selecting 4-H members who have demonstrated outstanding achievement in their 4-H project work. Books are judged against standard criteria. Those books displaying the most outstanding 4-H work, life skills development, and leadership and citizenship development are selected as state medalists and/or state winners. Senior 4-H member (at least 14 years of age and no older than 19 years old by December 31 of the program year for which the book is being entered) are eligible to enter state competition. Use the new 2015-2016 Record Book Manual forms for your records.

Encourage your experienced Senior 4-H Members to submit their records for the state competition. Instead of the three additional summary pages, this year seniors are asked to submit a resume, even at the county level. No additional pages are needed for a record book to be sent to the state competition. Accomplished Senior4-H Members should be encouraged to start working on their state record book now for the 2015-2016 competition. Set goals and plan ahead to have a great year in a project area so you will learn a lot and grow in your project skills. Consider having workshops in the project area during the year. Try some new activities. Continue to advance your skills and experiences. Get involved in some 4-H experiences above the county and section levels. Do some community service with your project areas. Be innovative. Try to Make the Best Better. Work in areas where you have high interest. There is a lot of good project work being done in LA County, but it is not being entered in the state competitions.

#### Friends Of 4-H

Each program year the County Council considers honoring an individual and /or organizations that have been particularly helpful to the LA County 4-H program. Each district is encouraged to submit names to the County council at its meeting in April for a Friend of 4-H award. Up to five such awards can be made for a year by the county council. If the honoree attends the leaders' appreciation luncheon, the award is presented then. If the honoree does not attend the luncheon, then the district nominating the honoree presents the award at a time convenient for the honoree.
