*If the leaders online training is not completed by February 28th your 2017-18 enrollment record will be purged.* You will have to complete the adult leader process by starting over.

New Adult Leaders will have to complete the following steps:

- Complete the interest adult leader survey
- Interview with the 4-H office
- Re-register your 4-H enrollment in 4-H online
- Re-process the live scan
- Complete the adult leader online training

Let prevent this from happening by completing the leader online training by February 28th!
