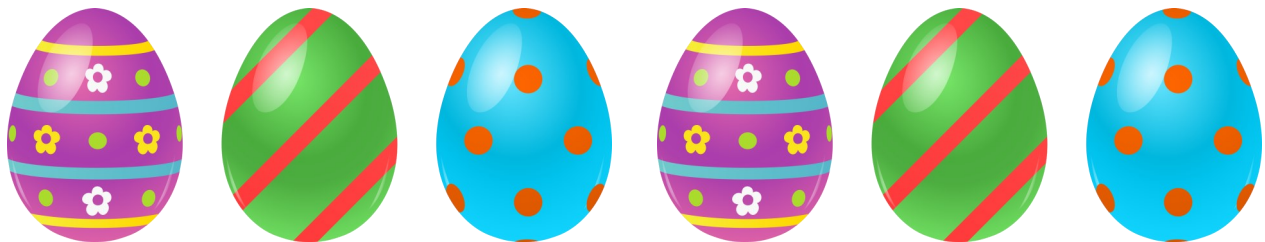
AUBREY'S ANNOUNCEMENTS

4-H SCHOLARSHIP INFORMATION & COLUSA COUNTY AMBASSADOR

Calling all Senior 4-H members (ages 16-19 as of December 31, 2018) have you ever wanted to be the person announcing awards at an event? Or have the opportunity to lead a countywide service learning project? Have you ever wanted to attend State Leadership Conference for free? Apply to become a Colusa County Ambassador (aka All-Star previously). You get to represent your county at multiple events throughout the year in one of 4-H's highest leadership positions available to youth. It is a great way to support your county and it gives you multiple leadership and citizenship opportunities. Applications are now available online or at the 4-H office.

Senior Scholarships are also open to apply. This year there are some requirement changes and we have removed the Record Book requirement. Please keep in mind that the people looking at your application will not have your record book to reference your accomplishments and how active you have been in the 4-H program. Please be AS DETAILED AS POSSIBLE in the essay questions portion of the application so the reviewing committee has background on your 4-H career. If you don't write it, the committee will not know it. Scholarships will be chosen based on 4-H merit, not based on academic grades, years in the 4-H program or financial situation. 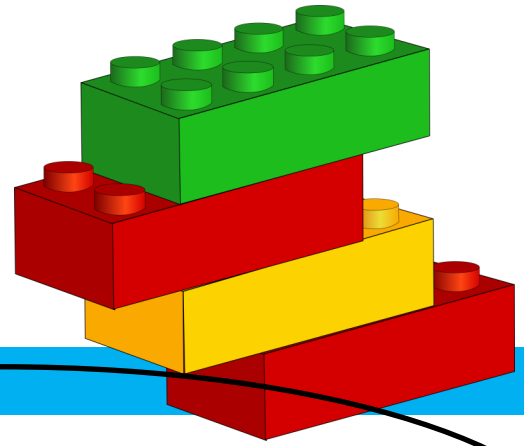

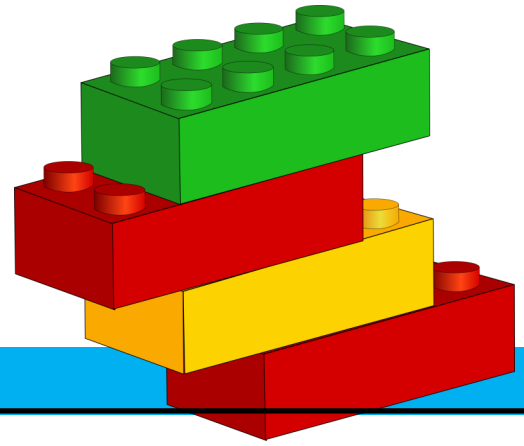


Gia Rudiger: "It was very, very fun! Making a car was my favorite part. They had special LEGO pieces at the class that we don't have at home!"





LEGO WORKSHOPS



Today, I built a battleship that was powered by batteries, motors, and pulley strings. I named the ship "Time Warp". I learned that if a gear is smaller, and is spinning on a pulley string, it will have more velocity (speed) and less torque. But, if a gear is bigger, it will have less velocity and more torque (power or strength). I had a great time building the ship with the help of my dad. By Jamison Porter

The next LEGO workshop is **April 28**. The **5-8** age group will be working on **Jedi Engineering**. The **Force Awakens** in this introductory engineering workshop for young Jedi! Explore engineering principles by building your own Star Wars ship or vehicle and then taking it for a test flight on our Zip Line. Will your ship stay balanced during its flight? Will it make a crash landing? Or will it successfully cruise through the Star Wars universe that we build using LEGO materials? All required materials and Jedi knowledge will be provided. No prior experience with LEGO or Star Wars is needed to participate in this engineering instructor-lead workshop.

The **9-14** year olds will be battling it out with **Bash'em Bots**! Have you ever wanted to learn how to make an amazing motorized machine from LEGO parts? Play-Well Engineering instructor, Matthew, will guide participants in this advanced engineering workshop. Participants will re-engineer standard vehicles into mechanized machines that can traverse challenging obstacles, battle against fellow bots, or take on Matthew's own LEGO Bash'em Bot creation.

The workshop will have the 5-8 year olds from 10 to noon and the 9-14 year olds from 1 to 3. You can sign up at any time! Classes are limited, so be sure to sign up by April 18 to make sure you're not left out! Call 458-0570 if you have questions. Each class will be \$20. Payment can be brought to the UCCE Office at 100 Sunrise Boulevard, Suite E or mailed to P.O. Box 180 Colusa, CA 95932.

In the meantime, while you are anxiously awaiting the LEGO Workshop, start thinking about a LEGO creation of your own to enter in the Colusa County Fair! We will hold a LEGO workshop day before the entries are due at the fair where you can bring in your LEGO bricks and build! The first one will be May 12 from 1-4, and the second one will be May 26 from 9 a.m. to 4 p.m. Please let us know if you are coming so we can save a work area for you! If you would like to enter a paper entry form, they are due to the fairgrounds by May 3 at 4 p.m. If you enter online, the online deadline is May 10 by midnight! Let's see how many LEGO creations we can enter in the fair this year!

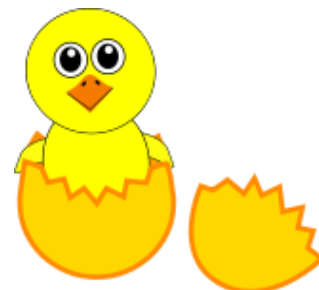

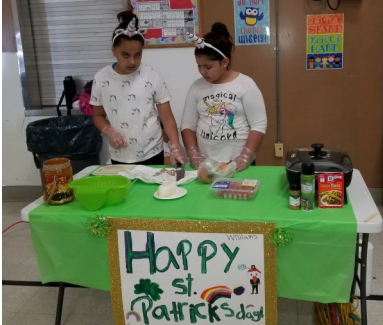

Colusa County Fashion Revue

"Fashion Through the Ages"

Date: May 6, 2018

Location: CIP Conference Room

Time: 12:00-5:00pm, Awards ceremony to follow fashion runway

Participants: Members DO NOT have to be in a clothing project to enter Fashion Revue, but will need to enroll in the county-wide fashion review project in 4-H Online. Each member may enter up to 2 outfits.

Judging: Participants will be judged on the craftsmanship of their outfit according to the Fashion Revue guidelines. Modeling is an integral part of the Fashion Revue and participants will be judged on their modeling. They are expected to participate in the fashion runway event. Entries due online by: April 20, 2018 11:59pm (No late entries accepted!) Paper Entry forms are available at the 4-H Office. Paper entry forms need to be turned in by 5pm at the office on April 20th. You may enter online here: <http://ucanr.edu/survey/survey.cfm?surveynumber=24412>

The outfit must be produced and modeled by the individual member during judging and the fashion show (not created for someone else). All outfits must meet the 4-H Dress Guidelines, found at <http://4h.ucanr.edu/files/210170.pdf>.

The 5 categories for 2018 State Fashion Revue are Traditional, Upcycled, Consumer Science Purchased \$40 limit, and the 2 challenges: See It, Sew It Challenge and Retro/Vintage Inspired Challenge. Only these 5 categories are included for 2018 at the state event. All entries in the state event must conform to the State Fashion Revue category rules.

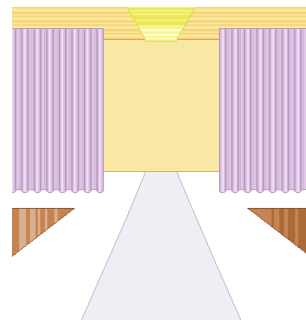

FASHION REVIEW

Consumer Science Purchased, \$40.00 Limit for the entire outfit, includes shoes but not sales tax. Receipts from the current 4-H year are required for any item that is visible. Gifts, prior purchases, and items without receipts are not eligible for this category. Receipts from yard sales, etc. may be hand written. The member should consider value vs. cost, versatility, the shopping experience, and coordination of the outfit within the cost limit. There is no 4-H project requirement; any 4-H member may enter this category.

Upcycled – take one or more existing garments and turn them into a new, different, and wearable garment. Additional fabrics, trim and supplies may be used during the construction process. The upcycled garment must be sewn by the member as part of the 4-H Clothing & Textiles project. Additional upcycled and/or sewn garments are encouraged to complete the outfit. A “before” photograph showing the original garment(s) is required. This is not an alteration - such as a large dress taken in to fit a smaller person that still retains the same lines. It is where the garment has been cut apart and remade into a new garment that looks different. The emphasis is on the transition of the garment. The outfit entered in the Upcycled category must include an accessory of your choice, handmade by the participant.

See It, Sew It Challenge Have you found an outfit online or in a magazine that you would love to copy for yourself? This category is perfect for you! Start with a picture of a new garment or outfit from a current magazine, catalog, store display, or website. List the retail price if you were to purchase the garment or outfit. Then get creative and copy it. Include the cost of your sewn garment/outfit. Use of a commercial or hand-drawn pattern is your choice (the original picture cannot be from the pattern envelope.) The garment must be made in the Clothing and Textiles project. The focus of this category is copying a new garment and making it fit you. The entry should only be modified for fit, type of fabric, or color/print of fabric, keeping it as close to the original as possible. Copying a vintage Lucille Ball dress, for example, would be in the Retro Challenge.

Retro/Vintage Inspired Challenge

Create an outfit that is inspired by a vintage design using new fabric and notions. Vintage is 20-100 years old, so use an inspiration that is from 1900-2000. The entry must state the year or period of the design and include a drawing, photo, or description of the design that inspires your outfit. At least one garment must be handmade by the member. Other garments and accessories can be handmade or purchased but must be representational of the same era. There is no 4-H project requirement; any 4-H member may enter this category.

Ideas for sources of inspiration include but aren't limited to: a sewing pattern that belonged to your parent, an outfit worn by your parent or grandparent in their youth, an iconic outfit worn by someone famous like Lucille Ball, Nancy Reagan, John Wayne, or James Dean, or use one of the new sewing patterns labeled Retro.
