4-H Age Requirements

Fresno Fair and the new 4-H program year will be upon us before we know it. Let's review the age requirements as it can be confusing. The 4-H program year runs July 1st through June 30th. When the new program year begins July 1st 2018, 4-H YDP ages members as of Dec. 31, 2018. This means an 8 year old that turns 9 before December 31, 2018 is eligible to be a regular member and participate in large animal projects. However, Fresno Fair must adhere to CDFA rules which require exhibitors to have been 9 years old as of December 31 of the previous year or 2017 for this years fair. As project leaders please review these dates carefully and make certain of members fair eligibility before livestock purchases are made. There were members last year that made purchases only to find they were age ineligible for the county fair. How disappointing for the 4-Hers and frustrating for the parents. 4-H Neighbors in Need

We have a club in the south area of Santa Barbara County that has been hit hard by the fire, floods and rains that have been happening since December. Here is a little information about them: The Playa Del Sur 4-H Club located in Carpinteria, is currently dealing with the 5th evacuation since their livestock facility flooded on Tuesday, January 9, around 4:00 am when the Arroyo Paredon Creek overflowed. The overflow directed mud and debris over Foothill Road through the club's livestock facility. The mud and debris flow tore through the 4-H livestock farm and swept away most everything the group owned—lamb pens and houses, tack room, generator, livestock scales, all show supplies and equipment, tools, wheelbarrows, feed, and more. With ongoing mandatory evacuations, they have had to move 7 livestock animals and can only move 3 animals at a time, so evacuation has been time consuming.

The effect of the flooding is far from over, now faced with mandatory evacuations and the ongoing task of rebuilding and caring for their livestock has become a formidable undertaking. As you can imagine, Playa del Sur membership is tired and they are working hard to keep a positive attitude while they figure out a plan for their livestock facility. Although there was no loss of life suffered by our Cooperative Extension Family– thank goodness – too many members and their families have suffered; jobs have been affected and homes had to be evacuated, some even destroyed. Times like these help us to remember and focus on the important things in life, like this community that has come together in the face of tragedy. Our thoughts are with the members and families of the Playa Del Sur Club. The members of Playa Del Sur 4-H are extremely grateful for those who have contributed to the rebuilding process. A parent volunteer from one of our clubs has organized a list of the club's inventory that was lost or destroyed and has asked that we share this information out.



The Fresno FiberArts Guild, Inc. has several purposes that focus on preserving fiber arts, educating the public about fiber arts and encouraging cooperation among fiber artisans. Many of our programs focus on promoting interest and education in the fiber arts. Two ways we accomplish this is through our scholarship and grant programs.

Each year the Guild awards one or two \$1000 Legacy Scholarships, to students studying in a college or university majoring in some aspect of fiber arts. Applications are generally available in early January and must be completed and returned in April with two letters of recommendation and the applicant indicating who their mentor has been that encouraged their fiber arts interest and learning. Scholarship announcements are made in mid-May and the recipients are expected to provide a display for the membership to see their work and fiber interests at either our Fashion Show or Membership and Workshop Sign-up Event (the third Saturday of May).

Each year we also award four Fiber Grants. The grants assist an individual or small group to complete a fiber-related project or class. Applications are available in January, returned in early May with a statement of purpose for the project and a budget for how the funds will be used. Recipients are expected to bring their project to a Guild meeting and report, sharing what they did with the funds. Grants are for Guild members as well as community groups with a requirement of being at least 9 years of age to apply. Groups as 4-H, home school classes and Scouts are encouraged to apply, as are individual's from the Guild's outreach programs. Grant awards are announced in mid-May and the recipients must report on their project at a Guild meeting by April of the following year.





It's time to start thinking about what you want to enter in the fair. In still exhibits you can enter anything you've made this year for a 4-H project you are enrolled in. Animal related entries include the Dog Show, Poultry, Cavy and Rabbit shows, as well as Pygmy, Boer, and Dairy Goat Shows. **Pygmy Goat written test, leaders to administer by April 30, test available at 4-H Office.** There is also a costume contest for chickens, rabbits, dogs, and goats. Animal and showmanship **entries are due at the 4-H office by April 30th**.

Livestock Achievement Day for members with livestock projects will be going on all day. Small animal exhibitors can participate in small animal achievement day. Registration for both of these is the day of the fair. However you must take the written test ahead of time in order to participate.

The 4H fair handbook will be available soon on the website. Be sure to use the new 2018 entry forms, not any left from last year. Entry forms also require the signature of your project leader or CCL.




