2. San Benito County Fair – Small Animal Tagging Our Small Animal tag pick up is Monday July 16th from 5-7pm here at Bolado Park in the Board Room.

- It is MANDATORY for any of your students Exhibiting Market Goats, Lambs or Hogs to have their animals pre tagged, photographed and fill out tagging forms. Leaders you will be able to meet with department chairs to pick up tags and information during this time. If you have any questions please call our office at 831-628-3421.
- Completed tagging forms, photographs of every animal tagged with the tag visible, and all unused and damaged tags must be returned to the San Benito County Fair office NO LATER than 4:00pm on Friday August 3rd. If tagging information is not complete and returned on time animals will not be eligible to enter San Benito County Fair.
