## State 4-H Updates


### Save 15% at JOANN and support 4-H at the same time!

### Announcing the 2019 State Fashion Revue Categories



1. **Traditional with \$40 limit** (unchanged from 2018); only open to 4-H Clothing and Textiles, aka Sewing project members.
2. **Consumer Science Purchased with \$40 limit** (unchanged from 2018); open to all 4-H members
3. **Retro/Historical Challenge** (formerly the Retro Challenge) - garments inspired by styles from before the year 2000; only open to 4-H Clothing and Textiles, aka Sewing project members.
4. **Box Challenge** (*our first NEW challenge!*) *For 2019 it is red/white/blue fabric and incorporates a list of items in your "box."* Only open to 4-H Clothing and Textiles, aka Sewing project members.
5. **Make it Mine Challenge** - altering a pattern or making your own pattern to achieve the fit and style you desire; open to all 4-H members

NOTE: The Upcycled category will NOT be offered at the 2019 State Fashion Revue, due to limited interest. As always, this category and others may be included in county fashion revues, but entries will not advance to the State Fashion Revue.

### 4-H Animal Science IS STEM Education



#### Science

4-H members involved in Animal Science projects learn about the anatomy and physiology of their animals. They also work with their veterinarians to help ensure that their animals are receiving adequate care and nutrition.



#### Technology

4-H members utilize technology to ensure that their animals are healthy and comfortable. For example, 4-H members learn about and may even utilize artificial insemination in some of their breeding projects to minimize the risk of animal injury and the spread of disease which may result from natural breeding.



#### Engineering

4-H members understand the importance of practicing good animal welfare practices and work to build and engineer animal facilities that provide a safe, desirable, efficient, and environmentally friendly space for their animal to live and grow.



#### Mathematics

4-H members utilize mathematics on a daily basis to raise their animals. 4-H members learn to create budgets for their animal projects and work to keep accurate records to document their income and expenses.
