Record Books help 4-H members practice records management, reflect on their 4-H work, and measure achievements. <u>Forms are available here</u>. Record books are due to club leaders or the Record Book adult advisor first.

Books are due for county judging by August 23 by the Club Leader Orientation (6-8pm) at 1682 Novato Blvd, Ste 150B, Novato.

Judging will take place on Saturday, **September 8, 9am-2pm** (date changed). Clubs are required to send one evaluator for every three books.

Members entering State Record Book Competition should review the <u>2018 4-H Record Book Competition Evaluation</u> <u>Process</u>. Intent to Submit forms are due August 31st.


