Leader Certification Meetings for the 2018-2019 4-H Year

The 4-H Youth Development Program of the University of California is committed to providing a safe environment for young people in all Cooperative Extension activities. <u>New 4-H Leaders and all potential volunteers</u> are required to submit an application, be fingerprinted for a background check, complete online trainings mandated by California 4-H, <u>and</u> attend a leader certification meeting. *Only after completing all of the above requirements satisfactorily, can a volunteer hold project meetings.*

The second Leader Certification Meeting for the 2018-2019 year is on Monday, SEPTEMBER 17, 2018, at the Chico Library at 1108 Sherman Ave, Chico, at 6:00 pm. The third and *Final* Leader Certification Meeting for the 2018-2019 year will be MONDAY, OCTOBER 22, 2018, at the Chico Library at 1108 Sherman Ave, Chico, at 6:00 pm. We will have Live Scan service available at the meetings, so please bring ID information and money for the fingerprinting. The cost is tentatively set at \$35. Immediately following the Certification Meetings, all attendees are welcome to stay for a special group session where we will complete the state mandated eXtension training together. This means; no requirement to log in on your own, a group to discuss what you learned, and a 4-H staff member to answer your questions.

September 2018 4-H Council Meeting

The first Butte County 4-H Council Meeting of the new Program Year is on Thursday, September 27, 2018, at the Butte County Farm Bureau, (2580 Feather River Blvd. Oroville), at 7:00 pm. This is where all the decisions about your 4-H program are made and put into action. Your 4-H Club should have one adult 4-H leader and one youth 4-H member there to be your representatives at our Council Meetings. If you do not attend, others will be making decisions for you. Every member, Jr. leader, and adult leader is invited. Come and let your voice be heard! This is a very important meeting as we would like all our clubs to start on the same page!

Club Window Display Contest

Does your club participate in the National 4-H Week Window Display Contest? Good locations for displays are store windows, school display cases, county buildings, banks, and libraries. The 2018 theme is "Inspire Kids to Do", (a campaign that will give kids more opportunities to do, empowering them with the skills they need to succeed in life and career). The Butte County 4-H Council will have awards of: \$75-1st place, \$50-2nd place, and \$25-3rd place.

Food Safety Certification

Annual training is required for adult volunteers who are involved with food service and preparation where the general public is involved. **This includes all fundraising and community service activities.** Any club anticipating involvement in food service and preparation activities must have at least one member complete this training. Please note that any food related fundraisers submitted to the 4-H Office will be reviewed for club compliance with this policy. This training is also highly recommended for any project leaders running a food related project. The University's "Make It Safe, Keep It Safe" Food Safety Education is available in an online format, and can be accessed at http://ucanr.edu/sites/MISKIS/Intro/. The training consists of six learning modules, as well as a pre and post-test. The post-test must have a passing score of 80% in order to receive credit and certification. **We have been experiencing some issues with the reporting system, so please e-mail Ryan at rpcleland@ucanr.edu with the date and time of completion and print a copy of your results for submission to the 4-H Office so we can get you a certificate as soon as possible!**
