



2018-19 Volunteer Training

All 4-H adult volunteers are required to complete online training courses in eXtension in order to volunteer with 4-H youth. The eXtension training sessions are interactive and most volunteers have no problems accessing and completing the training.



Record Books are due to the State 4-H Office by October 26, 2018.

To streamline the process, they will only accept Record Books submitted via the File Vault in the portal.

Some guidelines when scanning the records:

1. Include the County Check Sheet (as Page 1) and State Evaluation Cover Page (as Page 2)
2. Do not include dividers and/or a blank page in its place
3. Scan the record book as one document
4. Name of file should include members name and county

When adding the file to the File Vault please remember to...

1. Select Expiration Date of **ONE YEAR**
2. Include bcvales@ucanr.edu and gmmminer@ucanr.edu in the Recipient Email Addresses box

State Record Book Competition

For the 2018 State Competition, Record Books are due to the State 4-H Office by October 26, 2018.

The State Record Book competition is focused on selecting senior 4-H members (at least 14 years of age and no older than 19 years old by December 31 of the program year for which the book is being entered) who have demonstrated a well-rounded 4-H experience. Books are judged against standard criteria. Those books recording the most outstanding 4-H work, goal management skills, and leadership and citizenship development are selected as state medalists and/or state winners.

For the 2018 State Competition, Record Books are due at the Kern County Extension Office by October 22, 2018.

The State Record Book Evaluation for the 2017-2018 program year will occur between November 2018 and January 2019.

The Purpose of the State 4-H Record Book Competition:

- Provides an incentive to members to keep accurate records in their 4-H Record Book.
- Members receive feedback and encouragement on their 4-H skill development, leadership and citizenship development, and record-keeping skills.
- Members are recognized for outstanding 4-H work.
