Dear Monterey County Fair Livestock Exhibitors,

On September 27, 2018 the 7<sup>th</sup> DAA Board of Directors voted during the regularly scheduled monthly meeting to limit entries in the Junior Beef Cattle department to Monterey County only. Beginning in 2019, only those exhibitors who are residents of Monterey County will be allowed to enter and show in the Junior Beef Cattle Department due to the lack of available barn housing. This will include market and breeding beef divisions. The Junior Dairy Cattle Department will also only be open to Monterey, Santa Cruz and San Benito Counties exhibitors due to lack of available barn housing. This rule will be revaluated when new barns are in place.
