HOME EC TOUR



Home Ec Tour was Saturday, September 15 and we traveled to the California Academy of Sciences in Golden Gate Park. Enjoying the day were Tatum Mulqueeney, Emma Schloesser, Sydney Erickson,

Morgan Erickson, and Jordan McPeek. We walked through an aquarium, rainforest, and the living roof of the museum. We also experienced a simulation of an earthquake! A good time was had by all!

SCHOOL ENRICHMENT

This year we are launching some of our new STEM school enrichment kits available to all teachers in Colusa County!

Entomology in the Classroom (recommended grade range 3-6th) – This 6 part series teaching youth about the fascinating world of insects through learning about their different parts and stages of life through a hands on live lifecycle in your classroom! The series includes, Painted Lady Butterflies, Ladybugs, Silkworms, Praying Mantids and Ants. You can choose to have all of the kits or just one if you like, each kit is \$20 to cover the costs of the live animals and refilling the kit.

Junk Drawer Robotics (recommended grade range 6-9th) – Teach youth how to build robotics with items you can find around your house! In Junk Drawer Robotics: Robots on the Move, you will design and build machines that roll, slide, draw or move underwater and explore robot mobility – movement, power transfer and locomotion. Each kit is \$25 to refill the kit with required supplies.

Coming soon: Chicks in the Classroom – Youth learn about the reproductive process of chickens as they study the development of chicks through their 21 day incubation process. Watch the chicks enter the world as they hatch right in front of your students eyes! Everything needed is included in this kit, teacher is responsible for suppling their own fertilized eggs, resources will be provided.



Fair Eligibility Requirements for Colusa County 4-H'ers Due to the 4-H Office by November 1, 2018 at 5 p.m.

In order to exhibit at the 2019 Colusa County Fair, all 4-H members must meet the requirements set by the <u>Steps to Success</u> as well as the following requirements:

- Online enrollment, payment, and this form completed by November 1, 2018
- Attendance of 6 community club meetings and a minimum of 6 hours of project meetings (of those projects which will be exhibited at the fair) <u>or more</u> as required by the Project leader.
 - o Arrangements may be made with leaders to make up missed meetings for credit
- Attendance at 1 or more Field Days or Home Ec Revue for non-livestock projects
- Attend Animal Project Field Day for livestock projects
- Complete Home Ec Judging at Home Ec Review or Small Animal Field Day
- Complete 1 or more presentation(s) at project, club, or county level
 - Presentation opportunities include
 - Project meetings (as provided by leader)
 - Club Meetings (as provided by leader)
 - County Presentation Day
 - Arbuckle 4-H Presentation Night
 - Council Meetings (available with prior arrangement)
 - Craft Expo. (activity teaching a craft)

Any 4-H'er not exhibiting at fair only needs to meet the requirements of their desired level of participation as set by the <u>Steps to Success</u>

Failure to complete the Fair Eligibility Requirements will result in the Community Club Leader pulling the members incomplete project entry (ies) from the fair.
