- II. Flag Salute and 4H Pledge by Ericka Boesel (U) flag, Hannah James(L) and Kassandra Basler (L) pledge
- III. Introduction of Guests Erin Holzhauer T.R.A.I.L. Teaching Riding as an Access to Independent Living
 - a. Therapeutic riding program. Started 1993 by group of 4h'ers in Willits club and has since spread to members from countywide. TRAIL is a 501(C) 3 non=profit this allowed them to get horses that specialize in therapy work. Allows program to service adults and children and hire a PATH certified instructor and aids and have a successful program.
 - b. Clients have autism, processing disorders, PTSD, asperger's cerebral palsy etc. Benefits: horses movement is closest to our own and their steps are similar to ours in our normal gait. This creates/mimics normal human movement to/for the riders. This helps improve mobility in the rider, creates confidence, relax as well as increase muscle movement and tone. Helps with focus, tactile stimulation, decompression etc.
 - c. Horses help client work on social skills maintain space, watch body movements, be a leader etc
 - d. Volunteer opportunities: head walker: help regulate pace of horse, watch horses movements form the front, side walkers: supporting client physicially, help for safety, help give instruction. Care takers: help care for horses as an athlete, maintain conditioning, clean stalls, work with kids, help fundraise etc
 - e. Program has also opened up new career paths for the volunteers who have decided to have a career in allied fields ie attorney for children, work rehabilitation etc

She will also come to any meetings to talk about program, give demonstration with dolls etc. Program is Sun Thus all day for those that want to help. Check in with Erin first for privacy reasons. This would be an excellent opportunity if your club needs community service, a speaker for a meeting, recreation for a meeting, etc Make sure members are signed up for TRAILS program to be covered by insurance can also be a project is wanted, can be civic engagement etc. Assistance doesn't

have to be long term – can be for a short time ie two months or four months or once monthly or every other month etc. Have to attend training first but they are offered many times throughout the year. Operate all year around but right now there is not a covered arena – they are in the processing of fundraising for a covered arena.

- V. Treasurer's Reports see attached
 - a. Changes to balance sheet working on getting a more complete inventory of hard assets (IE curtains, laminating cart) as they are located. They were not originally on balance sheet so they are being placed onto the balance sheet
 - b. Notice the sub accounts of funds that we are holding for other purposes etc We have to keep that money separate until the time at which those funds are converted to the general fund
 - c. Received a donation from Pacific Redwood Medical group for \$2500 the Emergency room doctors. A portion of the money (\$1000) will be used to help us purchase a water tank for Redwood Riders. Redwood Riders lets 4H use their arena for training and events as well as their old flags for color guard. They have also agreed to help with our horse activities and would like to sponsor more horse events for the youth. The remaining \$1500 has not yet been earmarked but will go into the general fund
 - d. For enrollments: when a member is enrolled online there are NO refunds. Your club will have to pay for them anyway. IF your club has received enrollment papers do NOT enroll them unless you, as a club, are going to pay for the enrollment fees we will get billed by the State for ALL enrollments even if the members later drop. The exception to this is for those that are requesting a fee waiver ie 'scholarship', whether partial or full the club MUST make sure the proper forms are completed in order for the Council to pay for the enrollment fees. These fees are not paid for by the State but are paid for by the Council.
 - e. Nadine will be sending out invoices in November to the clubs for enrollment fees that are due by the clubs.

- VII. Staff Reports Linda Edgington
 - a. A new advisor has been hired. Her name is Carmen and she will start January 11, 2016. She is moving here from Nebraska. She will be working out of the Ukiah office. Not sure what her duties will be as far as helping 4H program
 - b. Leader Orientation done one set already on the Coast. Leaders must have turned in enrollment form, fingerprints AND been cleared, they get link to video online, pass with 18/20 questions THEN meet with Linda approx. 1.5 hrs on how to lead a project, university life skills experiential learning, thrive etc. Get updated leader manual, existing leaders will have to have some continuing education to keep up with policy changes. Leaders fingerprinted prior to 2003 will have to re-done due to changes in criminal record reporting processes by other agencies.
 - c. Leader changes more focus by the state on experiential training

- d. Treasurer training for the members, Linda is doing one on one and group training. MUST bring books up to state requirements for club reporting and to keep a system of checks and balances in place to catch any reporting errors
- e. Officer Training Linda can do training for the new officers in your club but will need help from the clubs. She will plan a group officer training next year so they can all get trained at the same time rather than individual club trainings
- f. National Science Experiment Wed Oct 7^{th} at Ukiah 4H office. Have 4 kits for club (1 for the coast) if they want to use them. For ages 10 and up, involves motion etc. Linda will be at Coast Oct 12^{th} .
- g. Extravaganza Need a club to host Extravaganza. We have a Fashion Review committee, Stills needs a committee, we have a food committee. We need a club to host Linda will ask RV/C as they did not host last year due to lack of participation.
- h. Project Leader Networking Linda will send all leaders a list of other leaders for their projects so they can arrange to meet together and create project specific field days etc
- i. Club outreach Linda and Hannah Bird of Hopland Field station had a booth at REF and Boonville fair collected information from attendees interested in 4H. Information was forwarded to individual clubs so they could contact potential members. Also got the names of three adults in Anderson Valley who were interested in being project leaders.
- j. National Shooting Sports instructor workshop Linda went to Pistol discipline and will be certified to train people to be project leaders (pending final approval at workshop). There were 30+ attendees from California that were being trained to be shooting sports instructors (various disciplines) for project leaders. She is also certified to train trainers/leaders in rifle, shotgun and archery. If someone is interested in being a shooting sports leader, contact Linda to arrange training to be a shooting sports leader
- k. Archery Training will be held on coast shortly as the coast has some people interested in the project
- Western Heritage Shooting is having a training in mid state in March 2016 for those that are interested in being a project leader for the Western Heritage project – see Linda if you are interested
