Reminder of 4-H Financial Policy

The University holds that the occasional participation of 4-H members in fundraising activities in support of outside groups and organizations as part of a service learning activity provides a high-quality youth development experience. Guidelines are available at http://dh.ucanr.edu/files/156259.pdf.

- Groups or organizations must not be religious or political in nature or purpose.
- The UCCE 4-H Office must approve the group or organization as an appropriate recipient of fundraising efforts.
- Fundraising activities must be clearly identified as benefiting the recipient group or organization so donors understand who is receiving the goods or services.

4-H groups may collect non-cash items or cash contributions that are then used to buy supplies and materials to carry out their service learning activity. They may not donate cash to any group or organization outside of 4-H. Frequently asked questions are at http://4h.ucanr.edu/files/156260.pdf.

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
