Types of Grants

1. JOANN 4-H Service Learning Project Grant

Projects must be from the <u>Qualifying Project List</u> and focus on a service learning project. Service Learning projects address a community issue and focus on creating and carrying out a plan to address the issue.

Number of awards: Up to two (2) \$450 awards

2. JOANN 4-H Spark Project Grant

Projects must be from the <u>Qualifying Project List</u> that focuses on a person's spark! Sparks are what help youth see the potential within themselves.

Number of awards: Up to four (4) \$200 awards

3. JOANN 4-H Innovative Project Grant

Projects must be from the <u>Qualifying Project List</u> and utilize the latest STEM innovations. Examples: 3-D printed fabrics, wearable technology, fabric design Number of awards: Up to three (3) \$500 awards
