

## Emergency

An INDIVIDUAL emergency is a single incident involving just one location, and only a few animals, people, and possibly vehicles or structures.



## Disaster

A natural or human-made event involving a large area and MULTIPLE LOCATIONS, such as a fire, flood, earthquake, or bomb.

## **ASSESSING THE RISKS**

- Is moving your flock, (or herd), feasible?
- Road-ready coop? Transportation?
- A place to go?
- Safer at home? Or shelter?









## IN A DISASTER EVACUATION: RISKS

- Shelters are stressful
- Exposure to, or spread, of disease
- If you're going to go...
   GO BEFORE it's mandatory

#### Risks...

- Hazardous roads /stalled vehicles
- Vehicle breakdowns / fuel shortages
- Dangerous weather conditions
- Reunification can be difficult






## **Shelter in Place: Are you ready?**

### Assess you needs...

- Defensible space from fire, flood, quake, slide
  - feed, power, water, supplies
- Protecting certified organic status
- Advance Directives in place
  - Registered with agencies, Ag Department,
     Emergency Binder, signage

## **Equipment and Supplies in MULTIPLE accessible locations**











## **Awareness: Hazards on the Farm**

#### Hidden Hazards

- Electricity and Gas Down and live wires
  - Water and smoke conductivity
  - Propane and natural gas
- Septic tanks, wells, burnt stumps
- Toxic materials
  - Garden, household products, paints, motor oil, brake fluid, etc.)
- Fuel storage, pressurized tanks (acetylene/oxygen)



#### **EVACUATION PREPARATION**

- ★ Prepare on Red Flag Days!
- Fuel and stage vehicles
- Open electric gates & garage doors
- ★ Don't wait for Mandatory Evacuation Orders
- Move animals during voluntary evacuation
- Prepare defensible safe space for animals sheltering in place
- Post signs listing animals on site & location
- Spray paint address on street and driveway
- Close windows
- Leave doors unlocked, or key hidden
- Leave lots of water
- Turn off and unplug appliances

#### MANDATORY EVACUATION

- Know what number/agency to call in your jurisdiction
- ★ Call immediately to report locations of animals sheltered in place

#### **Animal Evacuation Info**

- Know who to call & where to go
- ♦ Line up help BEFORE you need it
- Practice loading animals
- Have multiple options

#### **LOAD & GO CHECKLIST**

#### Keep with you:

- Vet records and registrations
- Your Ready-kit, tool kit, first aid kit

#### Keep with animals:

- ID, vet record & meds
- Halters, ropes, fly masks
- Feed, water, buckets
- Slow-feed hay nets
- Pet food, water, bowls, can opener
- Collars, harnesses, leashes
- Carriers, cages
- Poo bags, disposable litter pans, litter
- Calming meds, toys, pillowcases

- Important contacts, maps
- ID in waterproof pouch
- Photo of parents + kids
- Insurance: policy # + contacts
- Prescriptions
- Cash
- Medical Directives

- First aid kit
- ☐ Glasses, contacts, drops, solutions
- Oxygen/dialysis + power back-up
- Cleansing & disinfectant wipesDiapers & waste management
- ☐ Toothpaste, brushes, mouthwash
- ☐ Multi-purpose lotions, soaps, etc.
- Hand cream, sunscreen, lip balm
- Personal hygiene supplies

#### **FOOD & WATER**

- Water in bottles or packets
- ☐ Healthy, non-perishable snacks for all
- Foods for special needs

#### **SAFETY & COMMUNICATIONS**

- □ Phones, laptops, devices, chargers
- ☐ Chargers, cables, batteries
- Emergency radio, GPS/beacon locator
- Flashlight, headlamp, lanterns
- ☐ Gloves, boots, hats, goggles
- Whistles
- Car tool kits
- N95 smoke masks

#### **CLOTHING & COMFORT**

- Socks, underwear, workout wear
- Jeans, Tees, sweats, fleece
- Sturdy shoes, shower shoes
- Coats, rain gear
- ☐ Knit caps, sun hats, bandanas
- Emergency blankets
- Towels, sleep sacks, pillows
- Books, games, misc.

#### **ALL ANIMALS**

- ☐ Important contacts, vet, insurance
- Registration docs ID on animals
- Health docs, vitals signs card
- Medical Directives
- Photo with you & animals
- First aid kit
- Medications (ice chest if needed)
- ☐ Food, water, supplements
- Saline and eye care

#### **SMALL ANIMALS**

- ☐ Crates, carriers, cages, pillowcases
- Leashes, harnesses
- Bowls, can opener, water bottles
- ☐ Calming meds, thunder shirt
- ☐ Grooming supplies, wipes
- Disinfectant wipes
- Poop bags, pee pads
- ☐ Litter and disposable pans
- ☐ Towels, bedding, chill pad
- ☐ Sheets / covers for cages
- Booties, life jacket
- Toys

#### **EQUINES & LIVESTOCK**

- Slow-feed hay nets
- Lots of water, electrolytes
- Halters & lead ropes
- ☐ Fly mask
- Sheets, blankets
- ☐ Farrier & hoof care kit / easy boot
- ☐ Feed & muck buckets
- ☐ Rake, shovel
- □ ID kit livestock crayons & paint
- Mane tags
- Microchip info, photos of brand

#### ANIMALS SHELTERED-IN-PLACE

#### ■ Notify authorities immediately

- □ Call neighbors if can't get home
- ☐ Signs noting animals, locations
- Note disability/Diet Needs
- Leave hidden kev
- ☐ Gates & stalls unlocked
- Leave water everywhere possibleToilet lids up


