HOW TO APPLY:

So you want to do an Emerald Star project!

To apply and complete an Emerald Star project, simply

- 1. First think about what you want to do
- 2. Talk to your community club leader about your idea, they will need to sign your application.
- 3. Ask a leader to act as your advisor during this project.
- 4. Applicants can ask for a special meeting with committee if he/she has a problem with project deadlines.

Mariposa County 4-H Emerald Star Application and Guidelines

Application Due Date- June 30

What Does an Emerald Star Applicant Do?

An Emerald Star applicant must present a proposed project plan to be completed during the current 4-H year. They must complete this plan (part 1), submit a self-evaluation of their plan (after completion, part 2), and show good leadership qualities and overall 4-H work throughout the year. The member must present a project to be offered on a multi-club basis, county, or area level or in the community during the following year. Some examples are:

- Design a project manual
- Make leader's teaching aids for various projects
- Hold a mini fair for non-traditional 4-H audience

Please remember these are only example ideas.

The important factors to consider in deciding what to do for an Emerald Star Project are the following:

- 1. Is it something useful, something that is needed, is it a new project, or does it have a new spin on a former Emerald Star project?
- 2. Does it provide a chance for you to demonstrate leadership beyond the project level in your own club?
- 3. Is it a scope you can handle—area, cost, time, skills you have or can acquire, people involved?
- 4. Has a time schedule been prepared that is feasible?
- 5. Review plan with Emerald Star Advisor (4-H leader or 4-H Staff) before submitting to committee.
- 6. Who does it benefit and does it help fulfill "Making the Best Better"
- 7. The project should take place throughout the current program year.

How to Become an Emerald Star?

- 1. To apply to be an Emerald Star candidate, a 4-H member must meet the following criteria:
 - Currently enrolled in the 4-H program.
 - What star achieved or working towards?
 - In 7th grade or above.
 - Demonstrated leadership roles such as committee person, club officer, Junior/Teen Leader, or other roles in 4-H or other clubs or organizations.

2. Candidates for Emerald Star must complete the Emerald Star packet which includes:

- Complete Part One (Due June 30).
- Complete Part Two after project completed.
- Complete oral interviews as scheduled. Included in interview; budget, timeline/calendar.
- Meet with advisor periodically with updates.

Selection Process

An oral interview will be conducted by a committee of a minimum of five (5) 4-H Leaders from different clubs within three weeks after the application due date. This interview will provide candidates with an opportunity to verbally present their project plan, answer questions, and discuss 4-H.

The committee will ask the 4-H member the following questions and complete a weighted evaluation form:

- Is this project a value to the Mariposa County 4-H Program, members and/or leaders?
- Is this project a value to the community and to others?
- Is the project plan is realistic, practical and can it be accomplished?
- Does the project plan shows thought and is it in keeping with what 4-H stands for?
- If monies are involved in your project that may result in a net profit, where at the end of your project would you propose that the overages be donated? (i.e., 4H Counsel, Community Organization or Club...etc.)

Additional Meetings If Accepted

If the project is accepted, the member will begin their plan of action. There will be two additional meetings with the committee to see how things are progressing. The committee will evaluate if the member has successfully completed the at an exit interview.

What Will Mariposa County 4-H Program Provide?

The Mariposa County 4-H Council will provide an Emerald Star emblem. Emerald Star Advisor, 4-H leaders, and 4-H Council will provide leadership support.
