Things to remember:

- Please reserve the scale one week in advance.
- You may borrow it for 12 hours or less at a time.
- If scales are returned dirty or late, a \$25 deposit will be required for any club member to borrow the scales again. (Council Policy June 1996)
- To transport the scale you must have a pickup or trailer and two or more strong persons to lift it.

Due to the high risk of disease transmission, you must completely disinfect scales including undercarriage and tires **before** and **after every use**.
