#### **Club Treasurer's**

It's that time again to be completing your club treasurer's records for the year. All Club Treasurer books are due to the 4-H office on Tuesday, September 3rd by 5pm.

Please be aware that this accounting requires the annual financial report, club inventory report, the end of the year peer review and clubs should be submitting their proposed budgets for the 2019-20 program year.

Please contact your club leaders if you need assistance completing this process. You can also reach out to the 4-H office if you need assistance beyond the club level.

## **Club/County/State Record Book Competitions**

All members are encouraged to complete a record book and submit it to the club for evaluation and recognition for Star Ranks and achievement awards. If you sold an animal at the fair and wish to remain eligible to sell for the next program year you are required to at least submit your annual project report. Clubs have different due dates based on meeting dates. However, members generally should be prepared to turn in their books at the September meetings.

#### What to expect from a club record book review:

4-H Record Books are first reviewed at the local level by 4-H Community Club/Unit Leaders and Project Leaders. Club level evaluation is based on the Danish system where 4-H Record Books are judged against a standard. Seals are awarded based on the member's 4-H project work, personal growth and the book's organization. Through their personal achievements and 4-H participation, members may earn Star Rank recognition.

County record book competition is not required of a member. However all members are encouraged and eligible to submit their record books for competition. County record book submission deadline is **September 20, 2019** by 5pm.

#### What to expect from County Competition:

Members may submit their 4-H Record Books for county competition. Books are evaluated on the member's 4-H work, leadership and citizenship development, and personal growth. County level evaluation should be based on the Danish system with all books judged against a standard. Evaluators provide a critique and suggestions for future growth and involvement.

The State Record Book competition is focused on selecting senior 4-H members who have demonstrated a well-rounded 4-H experience. Books are judged against standard criteria. Those books recording the most outstanding 4-H work, goal management skills, and leadership and citizenship development are selected as state medalists and/or state winners. To be eligible for the State Record Book Competition you must have been between 14 and 18 as of January 1st of 2019. All State Record books must be submitted to the County office by **October 25th** at 5pm. All fees are paid to Siskiyou County 4-H by sending or delivering payments to the Cooperative Extension office, 1655 S. Main Street, Yreka, CA 96097.

Returning members should make every effort to be re-enrolled by **October 15, 2019**. New members wishing to sell an animal at the Siskiyou Golden Fair or Tulelake Butte Valley Fair must be enrolled by **November 15, 2019** to be eligible to sell a market animal. Any one is eligible to join 4-H any time during the year. However, if it is past the November 15th deadline they will not be eligible to market their animal through the fair as a 4-H member.
