4-H Families,


We are in dire need to fill in some positions of our Mendocino County Executive Council.

4-H youth members

The six-month overlap exists for those youth to participate in programs that were an extension or related to their previous program year's enrollment experience, e.g. fair, camp. They would not however, be participating in activities in the current year that were unrelated to the previous year's participation.



Enrollment Policy Reminder:

Adult volunteer re-enrollments (they were Active in the previous program year)

Per policy, 4-H adult volunteer appointments are valid for a period of 1 year, and there is a sixmonth overlap process for reappointments. As such, the 4-H adult volunteers have, until December 31st to re-enroll in the program, be appointed and made Active in 4honline for the year they are re-enrolling in. These adults are permitted to continue acting in their 4-H adult volunteer capacity to allow them to continue their service on July 1st, while they concurrently proceed with their re-enrollment in the new program year before Dec. 31st...

2019-20 Appointment/ Re-Appointment Online Courses are Open

The required trainings can be completed in one of three ways:

- 1. eXtension Learning Management System -Create or login to your eXtension account and take the course at your own pace.



RE: 4-H Program Updates

I am writing to address some of the concerns and rumors that have been occurring in the community about the California 4-H Program. In the April council meeting, we had talked about UCANR's budget shortfall which is affecting the 4-H program throughout the state of California. As a result, funding cuts to the 4-H community education specialist/program staff were made. As part of my efforts to seek out funding solutions, I am pleased to report that we have successfully secured funding for 2019-2020 through collaborative projects. As a result, a portion of both Jessica's and my time will be dedicated to a grant-funded project from July 2019 to June 2020. We are excited to be working on this project to advance STEM education to youth and to promote 4-H through this avenue as well.

At this point in time, I would like to make it clear that the Mendocino County 4-H program is still ongoing and growing. We are often looking to work with more youth through partnerships and collaborations, as well as through the great work of volunteers. We are fortunate to have opportunities to seek different funding sources in our county. As with changes in the statewide program leadership, we may anticipate some program changes so I urge that we wait to see what changes may be in place for the following year before sparking concern. As I get information on any changes occurring to the 4-H program, I will share them.

Current program needs

To ensure the continued growth of the program, we have current program needs that are more pressing.

- We are looking for members to fill the Executive Council (EC). The EC serves as board members for the local 4-H program. The Mendocino EC provides leadership to the Mendocino 4-H Council where decisions regarding the Mendocino 4-H program is made. This is important to ensure that the Mendocino 4-H community are involved in driving the direction of the Mendocino 4-H program.
- We are looking for participation in more local fundraising. Our increased interest and efforts in fundraising have been a long-time coming for various programmatic needs including, but not limited to, supplies, curriculum, and youth scholarships. We have had many ideas over the years and would finally like them to happen with your help. We will be hosting some fun annual fundraising events and would like everyone to be a part of it! If you have some ideas for fundraising, we would also love to hear about them.
