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Humboldt County 4-H Youth Development Program ANIMAL SCIENCE POSITION DESCRIPTION

General Description

The Animal Science Leader is a 4-H adult volunteer who serves on the 4-H Program Development Team (PDT), and chairs the Animal Science Committee. The Committees' overall responsibility is the development and delivery of Animal Science programs, events, and activities in the Humboldt County 4-H Youth Development Program (YDP).

The programs, events and activities under Animal Science Committee may include

- Ag Day
- Horse, Poultry, and Rabbit/Cavy Shows
- Large and Small Animal Workshops
- Bio-Security Education
- Fair Auction Liaison

Objectives

- 1. To strengthen the educational quality of Animal Science programs, events and activities of Humboldt County 4-H YDP.
- 2. To deliver programming in Animal Science that is consistent with the University of California 4-H YDP Framework.
- 3. In partnership with PDT Leaders, to incorporate science, engineering and technology; healthy living; and citizenship and leadership in Animal Science programs.
- 4. To ensure and maintain effective communication between the Animal Science Committee, Outreach and Visibility Committee, PDT, Management Team, and 4-H YDP Staff.
- 5. To provide leadership and support to 4-H Volunteers, including: a) Experiential and Inquiry-Based Learning; b) Youth Adult Partnerships; and c) Positive Youth Development.

Specific Skills

- Either an understanding of or a willingness to learn about the 4-H YDP, especially in the area of Animal Science, Biosecurity and Veterinary Science.
- Interest in organizing and developing countywide and multiple county educational events and activities Animal Science based education.
- Strong leadership skills with a focus on communication and problem solving.
- Enthusiasm, patience, and understanding and the ability to communicate and motivate adults and youth.
- Experience connecting and working with community partners.
- Ability to build a vision with others and to move the group forward to make that vision real.
- Ability to relate to and work with youth and adults from a wide range of socio-economic and ethnic backgrounds.

Specific Responsibilities

- 1. Work closely with 4-H staff in the development and delivery of Animal Science programming.
- 2. Serve as an active member of the 4-H PDT and attend regularly scheduled meetings (approximately 3 to 4 per year).



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- 3. Serve as chair of the Animal Science Committee. This includes:
 - a. Serve as an important link between the 4-H PDT and the Animal Science Committee.
 - b. Overseeing the operation of the committee: setting meeting dates, reserving the meeting room, creating meeting agendas and other items needed for productive committee operation.
 - c. In partnership with the PDT and 4-H YDP Staff coordinate the recruitment, selection and orientation of committee members.
 - d. Assist the chairperson(s) of the Animal Science Committee to recruit members, set a timeline, adhere to policy, plan, implement and evaluate their educational programs.
 - e. In collaboration with the Program Development Committee develop, implement and evaluate activities, special events or project innovations in the area of Animal Science.
 - f. Ensure planning is based on direction from the Program Development Team, Animal Science Committee and the 4-H Program vision and plan.
- 4. In partnership with the 4-H staff, Animal Science Committee and other Leaders identify needs, and develop and deliver training and programs in Animal Science.
- 5. In partnership with the Animal Science Committee develop and oversee the Animal Science program budget approved by the 4-H Management Team. Authority to re-budget between line items or change budget as needed given the budget remains within the amount allocated.
- 6. As needed, recommend new Leader positions to the 4-H Management Team for approval.
- 7. When appropriate collaborate with 4-H Management Team and Committees.
- 8. Develop consistent quality programming, in partnership with PDT and 4-H YDP Staff, through leadership training and support of 4-H adult volunteers, and junior/teen leaders in planning Animal Science educational events and activities.

Relationships

The Leader will be responsible to the 4-H YDP staff and the 4-H Management Team. The Leaders will cooperate with other Leaders and members of the Management Team. The 4-H staff will coordinate a Leader orientation to assure compliance with 4-H and University policies.

Benefits

- Meaningful opportunity to serve others and your community.
- Opportunity to build your skills.
- Reimbursements pertaining to Leader work determined by the 4-H Management Team. Other expenses related to Leader work may be tax deductible.
- Expenses associated with workshops and conferences to enhance your role as a Leader shall be determined by the 4-H Management Team.

Term of Appointment

Leaders shall serve a two-year term, with eligibility for reappointment by the County Director. There must be at least a one-year period after the second term before reappointment can be made to the same position. Applicants will go through an application and selection process.
