Application for the KERN COUNTY 4-H LEADER COUNCIL SCHOLARSHIP

The Kern County 4-H Leader Council is the governing body of the 4-H program in Kern County. Each year members of the Council, supported by volunteer leaders and members, raise funds to help pay the operating costs of the program. Some of the money generated is used to provide scholarships to deserving 4-H members who are graduating high school seniors or college freshmen.

Scholarships are awarded (depending on the availability of funds and applications warranting) in the following amounts:

- 1) One \$450.00 scholarship.
- 2) One \$300.00 scholarship.
- 3) Two \$250.00 scholarships.

Payment of the scholarship award will be made directly to the financial aid office upon verification of enrollment. Verification must be received within twelve months of the scholarship award date or the funds will revert to the Leader Council.

STANDARDS OF ELIGIBILITY AND BASIS FOR SELECTION

- 1. The applicant must be an active member in good standing of a Kern County 4-H club and a high school senior or college freshman.
- 2. The applicant must have a minimum grade point average of 2.5.
- 3. The applicant must attend a university, college, community college, vocational school, or technical school within one year of receiving his/her scholarship award. If the applicant fails to enroll in school within one year of receiving the scholarship, the scholarship will be revoked.
- 4. The applicant must submit a certified copy of her/his transcripts from high school and any completed college work along with the application.
- 5. Two letters of recommendation are required to be submitted along with the application. One letter must come form a present or former 4-H leader who can indicate the applicants level of participation in 4-H. The other letter must come from a teacher, counselor, or other school official. Your family members are not eligible to write letters of recommendation for you.
- 6. All applications and supporting material (personal letter of introduction, letters of recommendation, and transcripts) must be delivered to the Kern County Cooperative Extension Office by April 15th 5:00 p.m. Applications packets may be mailed but they must be postmarked by April 15th.
- 7. An applicant may apply more than once for this scholarship as long as s/he is eligible. However, once you have been awarded a scholarship, you may not apply again.
- 8. Scholarships are awarded on the availability of funds and when the applications are warranted.
- 9. The applicant must submit her/his record book for review by the interview panel prior to the interview date.
- 10. Selection of award recipients shall be based on the following:

Presentation Formats—Presentation Day has something for everyone

Demonstration—Doing and showing how while telling how. The speaker makes something or does something and has a final product.

Illustrated Talk—Talking and telling about something using visual aids. Visual aids can include charts, posters, photos, slides, pictures or models.

Science or Engineering Presentation—A Science presentation focuses on making sense of the world. An Engineering presentation focuses on finding suitable solutions by weighing design choices.

Educational Display Talk—An organized visual presentation of a program or concept. The speaker introduces the display with an prepared oral presentation and then has a dialog with the evaluators about the display.

Informative Prepared Speech—A speech written to inform or educate the audience. The presenter seeks out accurate information, organizes it into a logical format and competently presents the information.

Persuasive Prepared Speech—The purpose of this format is to sway and convince the audience. The speaker addresses both sides of the subject and uses ethos, pathos and logos to influence the audience.

Impromptu Speech—One at time speakers will draw a topic from a hat. They will then have 3 minutes to develop a speech dealing with the topic.

Interpretive Reading—Speakers may read any published work that is age appropriate and acceptable for a public school classroom. The speaker creates the setting through voice inflections and hand gestures.

Share the Fun Skit—Groups perform acts such as skits and other presentations that focus on a 4-H topic.

Cultural Arts—Individuals or groups perform a costumed dramatic reading, musical, dance or other such performing art. May have audience participation.

2020 Impromptu Speech Topics

Impromptu speaking involves speeches that the speaker has developed themselves at Presentation Day within a three-minute preparation time. One at a time, the speaker will randomly draw a piece of paper with a topic on it. The topics will be developed from the pre-announced categories outlined here. From the time that the speaker is given the topic, they will have three minutes to prepare a speech.

Civic Engagement: Youth Activism

Civic engagement involves competencies to positively impact community and society. Activism may include seeking changes in the way things are currently done. Activism takes many forms, including addressing collective problems through joint action, mobilizing political pressure, and engaging in both formalized (attending public meetings, protesting, voting) and new forms of public participation (forming online affinity groups).

Healthy Living: Mental Health

Mental health is our emotional, psychological, and social well-being. Mental health affects how we think, feel, and act. It also helps determine how we handle stress, relate to others, and make choices. Potential topics: ways to destigmatize mental health issues, developing coping skills, or how 4-H can promote positive mental health.

Leadership: Character

An effective and respected leader displays virtues and values in addition to competence and commitment. The late civil rights leader Martin Luther King Jr. encouraged his followers not to judge people by their appearance, but by the content of their character. A person's character, good or bad, can inspire others to greatness or discourage them from trying

Science, Technology, Engineering and Mathematics (Stem): Environmental Science

Environmental science is the study of the effects of processes and interactions in the environment. One aspect of environmental science is studying ecosystems, that is the biological community of interacting organisms and their environment.

Intermediate Topics (11-13 years old)

My Neighborhood

Potential topics: safety and your neighborhood, connection and community among neighbors, or ways 4-H can help improve the neighborhood.

My 4-H Club

Potential topics: project learning experiences, community service and service learning activities, or youth leadership roles (like club officer or junior leader).

Junior Topics (9-10 years old)



EMERALD STAR GUIDELINES

In 1992 Kern County implemented the Emerald Star Award for 4-H members 14 years of age and older to enter a new phase of *leadership, responsibility, and citizenship.* This rank was added to give 4-H members the opportunity to enhance the county 4-H program. It also prepares 4-H members for All Star responsibilities if they chose to apply to become an All Star at a later date.

What does an Emerald Star do?

An Emerald Star applicant must present a plan of proposed leadership to be completed during the following one-year period. They must complete this plan, submit a self-evaluation on their plan (after completion), and show good leadership qualities and overall 4-H work throughout the year. The project or plan must provide service to the Kern County 4-H program.

Who is eligible to apply for the Emerald Star?

Kern County 4-H members who:

- Have completed two years of 4-H and were at least 14 years of age by January 1 of the current year.
- Hold the rank of Gold Star (this is optional).
- Are currently enrolled in a Junior/Teen Leader project.
- Are approved for nomination by the Community Club Leader.

How do you become an Emerald Star?

- 1. Identify an adult who will serve as adult advisor to the project or plan.
- Prepare the "4-H Emerald Star Application (Part One)" and submit it to the Cooperative Extension Office by December 1st or June 1st.
- Review the project or plan with the interview committee. An interview date will be set up after the application is turned in. At the interview, the applicant is to dress in the 4-H uniform or as you would dress for a job interview.
- 4. Complete your prepared project or plan.
- 5. Prepare the final report, "4-H Emerald Star Completion Report (Part Two)" and submit it to the Cooperative Extension Office.
- Applicant will give an oral report, 3 5 minutes in length, before the Kern County 4-H Leader Council.

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4-H SHOOTING SPORTS – HUNTING PROJECT/ CALIFORNIA HUNTER EDUCATION COURSE

This project covers the information required to take the California hunter education test and obtain your hunter safety certificate. The hunter safety certificate allows you to purchase a hunting license or hunt in other states that require proof of having passed a hunter education course. The project is open to junior, intermediate, and senior 4-H members (no Cloverbuds). The six meetings will take place at the UC Cooperative Extension Office, 1031 S. Mt. Vernon Avenue, Bakersfield. Students should bring a writing utensil and paper to each class.

At the end of this course, each student is expected to demonstrate proper safety procedures with firearms and pass the written exam with a minimum passing score of 80% or better. Failure to pass the written exam prohibits the student from obtaining his/her hunter safety certificate, and she/he must retake the entire course. State law requires that each student attend every session. Missing one or more class sessions automatically drops the student from the course. Being tardy for class is also grounds for dropping a student.


