Opening- The meeting was called to order by President, Brian Montes, at 7:04 p.m.

Pledge of Allegiance / 4-H Pledge: Isabella Arce led the pledges.

Review Minutes: A **motion** to approve the minutes as presented was made by Dominique Montes, seconded by Gina Montes and passed.

Reports:

Teen Council Update: Lauren Reyes reported that the Teen Council met. Today they received their Polos and distributed them out to the board. Everyone seems to like them. Four or five people have volunteered for Food Fiesta. So far, Sandy Jacobs said, six parent judges and 4 Master Food Preservers will help with Food Fiesta. There are now 5 members registered.

Officer Reports:

President's Report: The budget committee met on Saturday for a few hours. We went over the framework of how the county runs and handles its budget. We established a baseline for this program. There will be changes on how we do the financials. We are looking at actuals and how we report this information. The program will increase transparency. We would like to see where the dollars are going and what is happening with them.

Treasurer Report: Melissa Sara reported the following: October 2019 Financials: Checking- Beginning Balance \$33,157.22 Ending Balance \$33,157.22. Savings- Beginning Balance \$33,106.80 Interest Earned \$0.56 Ending Balance \$33,107.36. Melissa said that what she did was take out the amount that was used earlier this year. We would just zero out everything. There are copies at the back of the room. On the left hand side, you will see the budget items. The line #'s will change when we are approved for Quick Books for each subaccount. Under administration, we noted the line # 40 as miscellaneous. That is what was left over, including \$200.00 for Quick Books (every year). We added a chaperone fee of \$60.00 for the Mindfulness Retreat. We did remove the Arnold Fund because it does not touch our budget. It comes from a separate account. We did get confirmation for a Guthrie Scholarship of \$350.00. The Rach/Siebert Scholarship of \$500.00 was not shown as well. The balance right now is \$40,270.02. There is a check for \$136.31 to the UC Regents for supplies for a demo that we wrote. We have a bill for \$40.42 for an officer's meeting still to come. \$53.00 for fingerprinting is also waiting. There is a donation for State Fashion Revue for \$50.00. Also there is the California Management Board check for \$125.00 for Southern Area Dues. Melissa will be giving monthly reports. A motion to allocate \$200.00 for Quick Books was made by Stephanie Smith, and seconded by Esperanza Reyes and passed. Suzanne Montz asked whether leaders will continue to be reimbursed for fingerprinting. The answer is yes.

We are getting a new club its charter. There are a lot of new ways to grow our county. Rachel Corliss (TT club) spoke about gleaning and giving and beach clean-up etc. These are in addition to what we have now. Rita or Rachel may both sign-off on these projects. Melissa Sara talked about the Probation Department. County Wide projects will need a Host. Feb or March may have something with O.C. Animal Care. I&R committee is working. Do we want Rita to order uniforms for us--Yes. Rita spoke about our Financial responsibilities, membership, visibility, communication, robotics, participation in 4-H events, Building Legacy and Continuity, matching funds and many of the events that will be coming up during the rest of this year. Information will be on the website soon. Rita talked about the upcoming elections. Have elections in May or June so the officers can start the year running. Officer training can be during the summer.
