The same but different! This year will feature virtual Presentations with various date choices in March, 2021.

Monterey County 4-H Presentation event provides an opportunity for members to provide a prepared presentation in any subject area relating to their 4-H work.

All members can compete in this county-wide contest! Registration closes 2/19/21

What are the Presentation categories I can compete in?

All categories are fun, challenging and are intended to be educational. A full description can be found in the 4-H Presentation Manual (2020 version).

Demonstrations and Illustrated Talks- a demonstration uses the "show how" method to teach a skill. An Illustrated talk uses models or other visual aids to teach something.

Scientific or Engineering Presentation - This type of presentation focuses on finding solution to problems by weighing design choices

Educational Display Talk - An organized visual presentation of a program or concept. (This is not a science fair display, collection or project exhibit)

Informative Prepared Speech- the purpose is to persuade, inform or educate the audience on a single topic or issue. Notes may be used if they don't distract from the speech

Persuasive Prepared Speech— designed to sway, convince or influence the listener.

Impromptu Speech - the topics are pre-announced. At the competition, the topics are randomly drawn and the member has 3 minutes to prepare a time speech.

Interpretive reading - Any published written work that is appropriate may be used. Examples are children's stories, poetry, essays, speeches and excerpts from novels.

Cultural Arts - Individuals or group performances of dance, costumed dramatic reading, musical, dance or other performing arts.

All clubs will still provide judges to evaluate and complete the scoring. Ask your Club leader today on how to register!

What is a 4-H Presentation event?

Our 4-H Presentation is one of the most important learning experiences that a 4-H member can participate in and it's a lot of fun too! It provides an opportunity for members to demonstrate a prepared presentation in any area. Members are strongly encouraged to relate the presentation to their current 4-H project work or 4-H activities.

All members from 5-19 years can participate in a Presentation event. Members from 5-8 years will receive participation certificates only.

Members aged 9-18 are judged using the Danish System of Judging (Gold, Blue and Red). Everyone participating will receive comment sheets from the judges to help them improve their presentation skills.

Members that are awarded a Gold Medal may elect to continue on to the Sectional Presentation Day. If a Gold is awarded at Sectional you may advance to the State Level which is held in May at the University of California campus in Davis.

(A member does not have to compete in any of these events to fulfill requirements to achieve a Star Rank.)

Questions

What should I wear? 4-H does not have an official uniform. Your clothing should be neat, clean and appropriate for the presentation being given. Some members may elect to wear their 4-H whites, a costume or clothing that is related to their presentation.

Can my parents help me setup my presentation? No. The participant is responsible for setting up and taking down their presentation. By practicing numerous times you will be prepared and able to set up your own presentation.

Can I use live animals in my presentation? Yes, but include this information in your registration.

Important Dates— 2/1Told your Club Leader you want to sign up,

2/19 completed your online registration form,

2/25 had an adult confirm you are doing the correct category

3/1 know when your date and time slot is. Have everything ready!

When do I give my Presentation? You will be given choices through the online registration. You will be notified by the event coordinators on your time slot.
