Re-Opening Orange Tier

Hello!

Butte County officially moved into California's Orange Tier as of yesterday, Tuesday, March 30th.

The Orange Tier means we can occupy 50% of space's occupancy limits, not to exceed 200 people.

Below is a simple grid showing what meetings are permitted depending on our tier status. The full document with this grid is linked below.

County Tier Status	Indoor	Outdoor
Widespread (purple)	NO indoor in-person meetings, programs, or	Maximum 10 persons
	workshops	Maintain 6 ft. distance between all participants during activity.
Substantial (red)	Capacity = Area of Room / 36sq. ft. per person	Maximum 100 people
	or maximum 25% of room capacity, whichever is lower. No more than 100 people.	Maintain 6 ft distance between all participants during activity
Moderate (orange)	Capacity = Area of Room / 36sq. ft. per person	Maximum 200 people
	or maximum 50% of room capacity, whichever is lower. No more than 200 people.	Maintain 6 ft distance between all participants during activity
Minimal (yellow)	Capacity = Area of Room / 36sq. ft. per person	Maximum 50% of space
	or maximum 50% of room capacity, whichever is lower.	Maintain 6 ft distance between all participants during activity
