

About 4-H Record Books

The 4-H program has a long history of record keeping. The focus reflects the importance of this life skill in our daily lives. Completing a 4-H Record Book is a process where you record project and club work using a standard format.

Why have 4-H Record Books?

Completing the Personal Development Report in the Record Book provides you an incentive for participation, learning, and achievement.

Benefits of completing a 4-H Record Book:

- Practice Records Management Track your activities, events, profits and losses, skill development and learning experiences. In this competency skill you identify, create, classify, archive and preserve records.
- Reflect on your yearly work Document your skill development and learning experiences in a written report.
- Measure your achievements and growth throughout your years in 4-H.
- Set goals, pursue strategies to meet those goals, and record how you may have had to shift gears in the face of challenges and obstacles.

Plan Ahead.. Start Your Records Now

The 2020-2021 4-H year is moving forward. Decide what your goals are in 4-H for this year. Use the <u>Member Planning Sheet</u> to record your plan for the year. During the year, look at your plan and see how you are doing.

Officer Books for County Recognition

Now is the time for your club officers to be planning to create an officer book for their 2020-2021 club officer work. Officer books are evaluated for President, Vice-President, Secretary, Treasurer, Historian/Memory Book, Reporter and Other Officer. All club officers have a chance to earn a Gold Officer Book Medal for their Club Officer Work. Information for the county 2020-2021 Officer Book Recognition Program is on the <u>LA County 4-H website</u>.

Club Goal Planning

Goal setting and following through to achieve the goals are an important part of the 4-H experience. Each year clubs are encouraged to set goals for the program year. At the beginning of the year, clubs are encouraged to use the 4-H Club Program Planning Guide, located on the county website, to plan their program year. At the end of the program year, the club evaluates how they did meeting their goals.

Planning is also important for your club members. What are their individual goals for this year? There is a Member Planning Sheet available on the county website under FORMS. Encourage your members to complete this form at the beginning of the program year.

<u>2021-2022 LA County 4-H All Star Ambassador Applications</u> are due by Feb. 19, 2021. The application will be on the LA County 4-H website by the end of November.

Los Angeles County 4-H Emerald Star Program

The Emerald Star is an award given to a 4H member for planning and implementing an advanced leadership activity. Emerald Star is separate from any star rank. Emerald Star is not a 4-H rank. It has been designed to encourage members to plan and execute a goal outside the member's Community Club. The Emerald Star is for experienced 4-H members who have been in 4-H for at least two years and are at least 13 years old, as of Dec. 31st of the current program year. Each Emerald Star application will be evaluated for its value to the LA County 4-H Program, value to the community, practicality and feasibility.

Diamond Clover Awards

The California Diamond Clover is the highest achievement for which a 4-H youth member and young adult volunteers are recognized. All youth members and young adult

volunteer who achieve the requirements are eligible to receive this award.

Applications are accepted year-round. Applications are reviewed by the 4-H Incentives and Recognition Advisory Committee and awarded quarterly.
