Agapanthus	Fall, winter, spring		3 ft.	Plant same as grown in nursery
Allium	Fall	3 in.	1 ft.	Use for tall background planting
Amaryllis	Winter, spring	4 in. pots	1 ft.	Crowd in pot, leave top 1/3 of bulb exposed.
Anemone	Fall, winter	1 in.	15 in.	In areas with mild winters, or plant in spring
Begonia (tuberous rooted)	Spring	Transplant	1 ft.	Plant after sprout appears in leaf mold, hollow side up. Just barely cover tuber. Transplant to pots or garden
Caladium	Spring	3 in.	2 ft.	In the garden be sure soil is warm or bulb will rot
Calla (white & black)	Fall	2 in.	2 ft. white, 6 in. black	Good for north side of the house or fence
Canna	Winter, spring	3 in.	3 ft.	Plenty of water in summer
Colchicum	August	3 in.	1 ft.	Blooms without soil or water first year
Crocus	Fall	2 in.	In groups	Plant ten bulbs in ten-inch diameter area
Daffodil	Fall	7 in.	8 in.	Plant in groups in the garden. For growing in pots, be sure and crowd bulbs in pot. Top of bulb exposed
Dahlia	Spring	6 in.	1 ft.	Plant 6 in. deep but just barely cover tuber. Fill in more soil later
Daylily	Winter, spring		18 in.	Very little water before sprouts appear
Freesia	Fall	2 in.	In groups	Plant about ten bulbs in a ten-inch diameter area
Fritillaria	Fall	6 in.	1 ft.	Plant in background. Unpleasant odor
Gerbera daisy	Winter, spring	Crown showing	18 in.	Very little water before sprouts appear
Gladiolus	Spring, summer	6 in.	4 in.	Plant in groups, preferably as separate colors
**Gladiolus	Fall, winter	6 in.	4 in.	In warm areas, only where minimum temperature is over 32°F
Gloxinia	Winter, spring	Pots only		Use planter soil only. Plant in small pots at first and then more to larger as they grow. Keep warm
Hyacinth	Fall	4 in.	6 in.	Partial shade in warmer areas
Hyacinths in glass	Fall	Base just touching water		Keep in dark until 6 in. high, then filtered light. Change water occasionally
Iris (Dutch)	Fall	5 in.	2 in.	Plant in groups, full sun
Iris (Bearded)	Summer	1 in.	1 ft.	Spread roots outward, fertilize sparingly
Ismene	Fall	1 in.	8 in.	Will freeze in temperatures under 32°F
Leucojum (snowflake)	Fall	4 in.	8 in.	Blooms better second year
Lily (hybrid)	Fall, winter, spring	4 in.	18 in.	Prefer acid fertilizer in western soils
Lily of the Valley	When available	1⁄4 in.	1 in.	In pots use soil, sand or peat moss. In the garden, plant in shade
Lycoris (Spider Lily)	Fall	4 in.	3 in.	Very close together in clumps
Muscari (grape hyacinth)	Fall	2 in.	4 in.	For dwarf borders only
Narcissus (polyanthus)	Fall, winter	5 in.	8 in.	Can also be grown in shallow dishes with gravel and water

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Ornithogalum (Star of Bethlehem)	Fall	4 in.	1 ft.	Semi-tender, avoid freezing
Peony (Bush)	Winter, spring	2 in.	2 ft.	Prefers cold winters and acidic soil
Peony (Tree)	Winter		4 ft.	Plant same depth as in nursery pot
Phlox	Winter, spring	½ in.	1 ft.	Full sun
Ranunculus	Fall	½ in.	1 ft.	Just cover and water sparingly at first
Scilla	Fall	2 in.	6 in.	Plant in areas where they can multiply for several years
Sparaxis	Fall	2 in.	4 in.	Plant in groups
Tuberose	Spring	2 in.	6 in.	Very fragrant. Keep in background
Tulip	Fall	7 in.	4 in.	Plant in groups, shade in warm areas. Refrigerate bulbs before planting

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
