I have been the treasurer, secretary and healthy living officer. I have done many projects including market sheep, breeding sheep and dairy replacement heifer. I really enjoy showing sheep very competitively across the Western United States. I

have shown in many states including California, Oregon, Arizona, Utah and Idaho. I exhibited sheep at the 2019 California State Fair winning showmanship and reserve champion wether dam breeding ewe. 


