SWEEP and Healthy Soils Program: new grant framework proposed by CDFA







The California Department of Food and Agriculture (CDFA) will host a public listening session to receive feedback on their proposal to have a new **block grant framework** for the Healthy Soils Program (HSP) and the State Water Efficiency and Enhancement Program (SWEEP).

What is a block grant? Under a block grant framework, qualified organizations across the state may apply for state funding and then administer awarded funds to individuals for on-farm projects.

This change would impact the SWEEP and HSP solicitations, the disbursement of funds, the application timeline, and more. The goals of this public listening session will be to discuss block grants as a potential framework and receive stakeholder feedback.

The California Citrus Conference (CCC) is a free one-day conference organized by the Citrus Research Board (CRB) to promote current research efforts ongoing for the benefit of California citrus growers and industry. For over 25 years, the Fertilizer Research and Education Program, better known as FREP, has presented its pioneering fertilizer research. CDFA is Accepting Applications for the **Conservation Agriculture Planning Grants Program**

The Conservation Agriculture Planning Grants Program (CAPGP) is a new program that funds the development of plans that will help farmers and ranchers identify actions for climate change mitigation and adaptation, further environmental stewardship on farms and ranches and ensure agricultural food security into the future.

Applicants may apply for up to \$250,000 to prepare conservation agriculture plans. Applications are due October 23, 2022, 5 PM PT.

This program will fund the development of plans that will help farmers and ranchers identify actions for climate change mitigation and adaptation, further ranches and ensure agricultural food security
