Education reimbursement program makes 'significant impact' for UC ANR staff – and can for you, too

For our colleague Christine Davidson, the <u>education reimbursement program</u> – administered by <u>UC ANR</u> <u>Staff Assembly</u> – was a major factor in empowering her to pursue graduate school.

"The reimbursement program helped my decision when I was considering going back to school," said Davidson, an EFNEP (Expanded Food and Nutrition Education Program) program supervisor in Riverside and San Bernardino counties. "The financial support made a significant impact."

Through the program, which provides financial assistance for career and professional training and development, Davidson received a total of \$1,500 over the course of several cycles. She applied the funds toward completing a master's degree, which she said was "essential to move to the next level" in her career.

All ANR career staff employees (represented and non-represented) who have completed the probationary period are eligible to apply for funds from the education reimbursement program, as well as all UCCE County paid staff employees in good standing.

Davidson called the application process "very simple" – entailing gathering a few documents from her school records and collecting signatures. "It took maybe 30 minutes to put everything together," she explained.

To UC ANR colleagues thinking about applying for education reimbursement, Davidson wholeheartedly urges them to take the step.

"I highly recommend the program for those seeking to further their education, whether it's to pursue a degree or take one course to learn a new skill," Davidson said.

The next reimbursement cycle runs through April 15, 2023 (applications must be submitted by close of business on that date). For full details on eligibility, requirements and instructions to apply, visit: https://staffassembly.ucanr.edu/Subcommittees/Education Reimbursement/
