Treasurer's Report - Vanessa Walters, Treasurer, e-mailed the following information.

We have created Cash Talley sheets for the cash we collected for the two cash boxes at clover joy and they are in the treasure book along with form 8.8 and the deposit slips.

Attached is the updated excel file with the new checking/saving balance, the donation page updated, check clearance updated, and I added a new tab of month bank reconciliation- which I will add to each month for a quick monthly overview to make sure everything is accounted for in all accounts.

Our month checking is \$33,411.41 and the saving account is \$18,117.11.
