Derek Rulon has been a member of Bowman 4H for 9 years. He started as a 5 year old raising and showing his 2 pygmy goats. When he was 9 years old he started in the sheep project raising both a market lamb and a breeding ewe. This was the start of Derek's own flock. Derek's family has been raising sheep since his Mom, Crystal, was in Bowman 4H over 30 years ago. Over the years he has grown his flock to consist of about 9 ewes and one ram. Each year Derek cycles his ewes and helps with his family's ewes to make sure they breed for the Tehama District Fair in May. Derek has always enjoyed being able to take his own animals out of his flock to the fair. Recently he purchased a registered Southdown ewe and hopes to continue to grow his Southdown flock. Derek has held many roles in his 4H

from beginning on committees to being in different officer positions. Derek is involved in cross country, track and West Valley FFA. This year in FFA Derek made it to the State competition for Creed Speaking. Next year Derek will be an officer for West Valley FFA.

This year Derek received the Ron Knight memorial award for his sheep breeding project. This was the 2nd time he has received the award. This award is special to Derek and his mom because she was the first recipient of the award.





Lazy Daisy Cake

The recipe was requested by a 4-H Fair Still Exhibits judge. This recipe is a family favorite and it is from my great-great grandmother, passed on from one generation to the next.

Ingredients:

2 eggs (well beaten)
1 cup sugar
1 tsp vanilla
1 cup flour
1tsp baking powder
1/4 tsp salt
1/2 cup milk
1 tbsp butter



INSTRUCTIONS

Mix eggs, sugar and vanilla. Add quickly 1/2 cup milk heated to boiling point with 1 tbsp butter. Blend in dry ingredients, batter is thin. Bake in a round or quare pan at 350 degrees for about 30-35 minutes. When done and still hot spread the top with the following mixture:

3 tbsp. melted butter
5 tbsp. brown sugar
2 tbsp. cream
1/2 cup chopped walnuts

Bake under broiler until light brown. Watch carefully.


