Statewide Project: Become a Disease Detective

Are you interested in medicine, health, veterinary sciences, communications, civic engagement, or marketing? We have a 4-H project for you!

This project is designed for 4-H members that are at least 12 years old.

What will you do?

The 4-H Disease Detectives Project (created before the COVID-19 pandemic) will help you learn about disease outbreaks, virus transmissions, public health investigations, and how protective actions like hand washing, social distancing, vaccinations, and herd immunity help manage negative public health outcomes.

There are 11 lessons in total plus an orientation. Three lessons are new and discuss the COVID-19 Pandemic. Virtual meetings will take place on Sundays from April 17 to June 19 from 3:00-4:00pm or 3:00-5:15 pm depending on the content. The full schedule is on the registration. When you attend at least six hours of project meetings you will receive a STEM Project Pin!

Transportation: Minimizing Stress on Bees While Getting Them Where They Need to Be




Many beekeepers often need to move colonies to various apiary locations, or for local pollination, etc. What are the major stresses on bees during local and long-distance* transportation?

Writers are encouraged to include photos and interviews with commercial beekeepers, citing state laws for the transport of bees.



Los Angeles County 4-H Emerald Star Program

The Emerald Star is an award given to a 4H member for planning and implementing an advanced leadership activity. Emerald Star is separate from any star rank. Emerald Star is not a 4-H rank. It has been designed to encourage members to plan and execute a goal outside the member's Community Club. The Emerald Star is for experienced 4-H members who have been in 4-H for at least two years and are at least 13 years old, as of Dec. 31st of the current program year. Each Emerald Star application will be evaluated for its value to the LA County 4-H Program, value to the community, practicality and feasibility.



Diamond Clover Awards - The California Diamond Clover is the highest achievement for which a 4-H youth member and young adult volunteers are recognized. All youth members and young adult volunteer

who achieve the requirements are eligible to receive this award.



Awardees receive the California Diamond Clover Pin or Necklace Charm, a certificate and a recognition letter from the 4-H Statewide Director.

Applications are accepted year-round. Applications are reviewed by the 4-H Incentives and Recognition Advisory Committee and awarded quarterly.
