County Ambassador teams plan their own year of activities to create meaningful learning and service opportunities for themselves and others in their communities.

County Ambassadors develop an annual Plan of Action.

The team chooses and develops 3 of the 6 Leadership Competencies and completes one service learning project.

YQCA Training

YQCA must be complete by anyone between the ages of 9-19 for both market and breeding exhibitors. The only ones who are excluded are those showing just in the dog or cavy division! You can do the web-based training on your own for \$12. Completing this course will earn you the YQCA certificate which is required to show livestock at the Lassen County Fair. Turn your certificate in with your fair entry.

Go to weblink: https://yqcaprogram.org/

- Sign in to your YQCA account OR create a new account if you don't have one. If you do not sign the data sharing consent YQCA will not be able to verify the certification.
- Once you are logged into your YQCA account,
- Go to the Home Page and select a Course. Some of these instructions are for the instructor-led course but you should be able to make selections for your on-line and not instructor-led.
- Enter a coupon code or credit/debit card details. Follow the instructions to pay on-line.
- Following the training, log back into "Post Course survey" and access your certificate.
- Access your certificate by using the drop down menu under "Course Certificates".
- Select the + sign see drop down Competed courses.
- Select blue button to download the certificate. On a Mac computer the downloaded PDF will be available in your browser downloads at the bottom of the window in a downloads folder. On a PC, the downloaded PDF will be available in the upper righthand corner of the screen in a downloads folder. On a smart phone, the downloaded PDF will be in "My Files downloads. On an iphone, you will have the option to save your downloaded PDF to Photos, Files, or other applications you have on your phone. Rename and/or move the file to a location that is easily accessible for future use.

To Print your PDF, select the printer icon and send to your local printer. That's IT! Download your certificate from the YQCA website.

New this year!! There is the option of taking an online test. You can only take the test once. You must answer 50 questions with at least 40 correct. If you pass, you do not have to take the training. Just pay the fee to print your certificate. For more information, go to the website.

Include a copy of your YQCA certificate with your market livestock fair entry form.
