#### What is 4-H?

4-H is an informal educational opportunity where youth learn by doing in project areas like science, health, agriculture, and civic engagement. Our club offers a variety of activities for youth, ages 5-19. 4-H members take part in monthly meetings run by youth officers and explore their individual interests through projects. Our club is run by adult volunteers who plan and carry out various project meetings throughout the year. Members can also participate in a number of county, sectional (multi-county), and state-wide 4-H events. The annual program fee is \$72 per youth member.
