





Returning volunteers that do not have an approved and Active enrollment as of January 1st may not actively serve as a 4-H Adult Volunteer until they have completed all requirements, and their re-enrollment is approved.

Chico State Youth Livestock Education Day Returns!

This weekend, I went to Chico State's Lamb and Goat Field Day, and it was awesome! Even though most of the event was about lambs and goats, they had a special pig speaker, which was super cool. It was the first time they held this event in a few years because of the pandemic, so everyone was really excited to be there. At the pig session, we learned all about what pigs need to live happily, like food, water, and heat control. The speaker also explained a lot about medicine for pigs, which was really interesting. We ended the pig session with a tour of the Chico State Meats Lab where the presenter worked, it was amazing to see where they process everything!

At the lamb session, we learned that when you first get your lamb, it will be about three to four months old. By the time you take it to the fair, it should be around nine months to a year old. I didn't know that if a lamb starts growing its adult teeth, you can't take it to the fair anymore! Unfortunately, I missed the meat goat session, but it sounded like it had a lot of great information for people raising goats. I hope to go again next year and check it out. This event was so much fun, and I learned a ton about taking

care of animals like pigs, lambs, and goats!




Spark Achievement pins show member experiences and accomplishments in 4-H.


